At Bishop Perrin, we expect children who are at the end of Year 6 to be able to:

Reading

- read age-appropriate books with confidence and fluency (including whole novels)
- read aloud with intonation that shows understanding
- work out the meaning of words from the context
- explain and discuss their understanding of what they have read, drawing inferences and justifying these with evidence
- predict what might happen from details stated and implied
- retrieve information from non-fiction
- summarise main ideas, identifying key details and using quotations for illustration
- evaluate how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the
- impact on the reader
- make comparisons within and across books
- skim and scan to aid note-taking

Writing

- use subordinate clauses to write complex sentences.
- use passive voice where appropriate.
- use expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely (e.g. the fact that it was raining meant the end of sports day).
- use a sentence structure and layout matched to requirements of text type.
- use semi-colon, colon or dash to mark the boundary between independent clauses.
- use colon to introduce a list and semi colon within a list.
- use correct punctuation of bullet points.
- use hyphens to avoid ambiguity.

- use full range of punctuation matched to requirements of text type.
- use wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs.
- use paragraphs to signal change in time, scene, action, mood or person.
- · write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.

Maths

- use negative numbers in context and calculate intervals across zero.
- compare and order numbers up to 10,000,000.
- identify common factors, common multiples
- and prime numbers.
- round any whole number to a required
- degree of accuracy.
- identify the value of each digit to 3 decimal
- places.
- use knowledge of order of operations to carry out calculations involving four operations.
- multiply: 4-digitby2-digit numbers
- divide: 4-digit by 2-digit numbers
- add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers.
- multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in the simplest form.
- divide proper fractions by whole numbers.
- calculate % of whole number.

Attitude to Learning

- stay on task for extended periods of time
- independently prepare and remember the correct equipment for school including PE kits, homework and projects
- be responsible for their belongings and class resources
- be able to use a knife and fork correctly
- learn collaboratively with others or independently as appropriate
- discuss ideas in a small group and feedback ideas
- show resilience in learning, not giving up without trying
- solve friendship problems with peers
- independently select resources to support own learning
- be prepared to face new challenges in learning
- display enthusiasm and excitement for learning
- approach learning with a positive and constructive attitude
- give and receive constructive feedback appropriately
- select appropriate and creative ways to present work
- always have PE kit in school on the correct day
- always have Homework Diary in school
- manage time to ensure homework and projects are completed on time
