Dear Parents,

Thank you for all your help and support this term for all the things we do here in school with the children. It has been a very busy term with so much achieved and accomplished. This week has been as busy as any and the children have thoroughly enjoyed all the opportunities that have come their way.

In no particular order, we had a wonderful Year 3 and 4-led Carol Service at St Augustine's Church yesterday morning. The children sang beautifully and Years 3 and 4 guided us through the Christmas story with real confidence and enthusiasm. I am very grateful to Mrs Place for all the thought and preparation that went into the Service, not least her creative and imaginative script. My thanks also go to Miss Holloway for preparing Year 3 so well; to Mrs Cadogan for all her help with the rehearsals and keyboard playing and to Mrs Williams, one of our Governors but also a key member of St Augustine's Parish, who led our Service and who has helped with opening the Church for the rehearsals this week. Thank you to all the parents who were able to walk with us to and from the Church and for the generous donations for Homelink.

Reception Class were wonderful in sharing their version of the Christmas Story with so many parents and grandparents on Wednesday, with a performance in the morning and one in the afternoon. They sang and spoke beautifully and it was lovely to see them in the intimate setting of their classroom. I would like to thank Miss McAvoy and Mrs Vanstone for all the thought and preparation that went into the performances. The children have had a great first term at Bishop Perrin and it has been lovely to see them grow and become part of the BP school community.

The children had a great time on Tuesday at the Pantomime and were are very well behaved throughout. BP had the biggest cheer when all the names of the schools were called out! We are very grateful to the School Association who subsidised the cost of the three coaches we used with a £1000 donation. My thanks go to Mrs Nelhams, Mrs May and Mrs Forster for all their help in the organisation of the trip and to all the parents who were able to come along and help us on the day.

We were able to collect in a wonderful 108 shoeboxes for the Women's Refuge, which were collected by the Police on Monday morning. They had to make several trips in their cars as they weren't expecting so many boxes! They wanted to express their gratitude and thanks to all the families who were able to donate a box. Thank you from us, the school, to everyone who was able to send one in, as it is a wonderful reflection of the values we aim to share with the children of service, thankfulness and fellowship.

Miss Macklearn has finished her outreach work at the school in Fulham that she has been supporting this term. It has been a great opportunity for both schools to share good practice, but it has also enabled us to earn an income from Miss Macklearn's work there. We have been able to use the income to fund having a Play Therapist in school to work with children who need some extra support. We had previously been able to pay for the Play Therapist from the main school budget, but because of funding cuts, we had to make the decision not to employ her for this academic year. I am very grateful to Miss Macklearn for undertaking this additional workload whilst also maintaining all her commitments to Bishop Perrin.

It is with sadness that we say "Goodbye" to Mrs Zoe Hunt, who has been a BP member of staff for nine years. Mrs Hunt has secured a new role at a local secondary school, starting in January. We are very sorry to lose her, as she has been able to bring all her skills as a trained Speech and Language Therapist to help and support the many children she has worked with during her time with us. Mrs Hunt has been a valued member of staff and a colleague held in high regard and I would like to thank her for all she has contributed to BP during her time with us and we wish her all the best in her new role, which I know she will be very successful at.

On behalf of all the staff, I would like to thank you all for your lovely Christmas cards and thoughtful gifts we have received. We are very grateful for the generosity and kindness shown by you all, so thank you very much for your consideration. I would like to take this opportunity to wish you and your families a restful, relaxing and enjoyable Christmas holiday and to thank all the BP staff for their hard work and commitment with the children.
