Dear Parents,

We held a special assembly on Tuesday this week to talk about what we would do in school in the event of a stray animal or unknown adult coming onto the school site. We were able to all hear the new alarm sound go off so we know the difference between it and our fire alarm sound. We've called this our "Stay Inside Alarm" and we will be sounding it again three times next week at 10am (on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday) so we can be more familiar with it. We will then carry out an announced practice of what we would do if the Stay Inside Alarm were to go off for real. The teachers will prepare the children of what they would need to do if we were faced with this situation and we will stress to them that it is a practice and not for real. All the staff joined us for the assembly and we were all incredibly proud of the way in which they listened and the maturity they showed about the topic.

My apologies for the delay in getting information out about the forthcoming Parent Interviews, as I was hoping we could have shared this with you earlier in the week. Please make sure you read it carefully and you are aware of all the timings and changes to the way we have previously conducted Parent Interviews. If you have any questions, then please do not hesitate to speak to either myself or Miss Macklearn.
