THE TIMESTABLES CHALLENGE

Each week, children from different houses will be invited to come to the Reception classroom at 12pm on Tuesday lunchtime to test their knowledge of the timestables. Year 6 Timestables Champions will be on hand to support you to recite your multiplication tables and compete timed challenges. There are three levels of achievement – Stage 1, Stage 2 and Stage 3. For each stage there will be three levels to complete – Bronze, Silver and Gold. Children may attempt a maximum of two levels per week (depending on how busy it is). They will receive one reward each time they attempt the Timestables Challenge and one reward when a level is completed.

For each stage they will need to know and demonstrate fluency in different multiplication tables:

Stage 1 - x2, x5, x10Stage 2 - x3, x4, x6Stage 3 - x7, x8, x9

Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates confirming secure understanding at each level will be awarded in Celebration Worship once each of the three stages has been achieved.

To achieve Bronze, children must recite each of the tables in the stage. They may self-correct but will have only two attempts. There is no time limit.

To achieve Silver, children must complete a timed multiplication challenge within one minute.

To achieve Gold, children must complete a timed multiplication and division challenge which requires knowledge of factors and multiples within three minutes

Children will be given a personal record card which should be kept safe because this will be a record of how well they are doing as well as help to learn the multiplication tables.

This is an example of the Stage 1 Silver Challenge. Can you complete the grid in less than one minute?
