Dear Parents,

On Tuesday we had our Diocesan Advisor, Graham Marriner, visit us to take part in our Spring Term Learning Review which focused on our teaching and learning of reading across the school. Along with Mr Marriner we also had Mr Nimmo and Mr Storey, two of our Governors, take part in the Learning Review along with Miss Macklearn, Mrs Twitcher and myself. We were able to look at a range of English Books from all the classes and see the variety and coverage of the curriculum. We visited the classes to see the teaching of Phonics, Guided Reading and the teaching of Reading. It was incredibly rewarding to see how the children are developing and progressing in their learning of reading and the confidence they have to be able to speak about their work. We saw some really colourful and supportive displays in classrooms and corridors, all promoting the love of reading and exploring vocabulary and imagery. There were a few areas identified that we can continue to work on and develop and all the feedback will be shared with the Governors. It was also incredibly supportive to see how effective the Reading and Homework Diaries are and how often children are reading and being supported at home. Thank you all very much for the help and support you give your children at home with their reading, as this only enhances what we are able to do here in school. I would like to acknowledge all the thought and vision that Miss Macklearn has put in to ensuring that the systems we have in place to teach reading are embedded, thorough and robust.

Children in Years 1-6 had a great time yesterday during their African Drumming Workshops. There was a steady stream of rhythmic beats and chanting come out from the Hall and down the corridors and the children had great fun experiencing drumming as a group and a team. My thanks go to Mrs Place for organising the workshop and to the School Association who have kindly funded it.

The Boys' Football Team had a frustrating day at the Brentford FC 6-a-side Tournament on Monday this week when, despite playing some excellent football, they were unable to progress to the next stage of the event. They got off to a flying start, beating Collis (a four form entry school) 3-1. They then drew 2-2 with St Stephen's (a two form entry school) having been 2-0 down and then beat St John the Baptist (two form entry school) 3-0. Alas, the next two results, losing 1-0 to St Gregory's and drawing 1-1 with Fielding, (both schools which are not in our Borough) cost us the opportunity to progress. The boys can be very proud of their achievements and I would like to thank Mr Ghedia for his help coaching the boys and to all the other parents who came to support.

I hope that you've managed to book an appointment for your Parent Interview next week. This is an important meeting as we are almost half way through the school year now and it is an opportunity to provide you with information as to how your child is progressing against their end of year targets.

Thank you to the School Association who organised a very successful Infant Film Night last Friday. I know that the Juniors are looking forward to their Film Night next week, so make sure you get your tickets!

WORLD BOOK DAY - THURSDAY 5th MARCH 2020

Today we are launching our new reading project in preparation for celebrating **World Book Day**. We are asking all children to select a book from the list below and read it in time for World Book Day on Thursday 5th March. The books have been selected from the <u>Booktrust</u> '100 Best Books' list, by members of staff who will also be reading the books as part of the project.

On World Book Day, each child can come into school either dressed as a character from their chosen book, or bring in a prop associated with the book (this can be something they have made). At some point during the day, all the children will go and meet with the member of staff who has also read their book, to do some bookrelated activities and discuss what they have read with other children. They will not know who the member of staff will be until the day itself.

To help children to make a decision about which book they would like to read, there is a display of all the books located outside the Y5 / 6 classroom with descriptions of the stories.

We strongly encourage children to choose a book that they think they will enjoy reading, one they have not read before and one that is not too easy for them (see age references as a guide). *Blaces remember that Bisk* Children will be asked to sign up for their chosen book by Friday 7th February, to give plenty of time to read the book and prepare for World Book Day. We ask that once the children have made their choice and signed up, they stick with their decision, to help with group organisation and planning for the day.

We're looking forward to a fun day of book-related activities and hearing the children's thoughts of the books they have read.
