If you have any queries regarding the content of this booklet or want support in knowing how best to help your child please talk to your child's teacher. <u>At Bishop Perrin, we expect children who are at the end of Year 3 to be able</u> to:

Reading

- read fluently and with appropriate expression
- apply knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes
- explain the meaning of words in context
- comment on characters' actions and decisions
- retrieve information from non-fiction books
- explain what they have read and begin to draw inferences
- use a dictionary to check the meaning of words

Writing

- join letters correctly and legibly
- use full stops, capital letters, commas, question marks, exclamation marks, speech marks and apostrophes
- use alphabetical order to look up words in a dictionary or thesaurus
- express time and cause using conjunctions
- use paragraphs to group related material
- use headings and subheadings for layout
- use suffixes and prefixes
- write in the correct tense
- correctly use verbs in the first, second and third person

<u>Maths</u>

- compare and order numbers to 1000
- find 10 or 100 more/less than a given number
- recognise place value of 3-digit numbers
- add and subtract 3-digit numbers and ones/tens/hundreds
- add and subtract numbers with up to 3-digits using written columnar method
- recall 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables
- multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number
- compare and order fractions with the same denominator
- add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole
- tell the time to the nearest minute
- measure accurately using standard units

Attitude to Learning

- stay on task for the duration of an activity
- independently prepare remember the correct equipment for school
- be responsible for their belongings and class resources
- be able to use a knife and fork correctly
- learn collaboratively with others
- discuss ideas in a small group and feedback ideas
- show resilience in learning, not giving up without trying
- solve friendship problems with peers
- independently select resources to support own learning
- be prepared to face new challenges in learning
- display enthusiasm and excitement for learning
