The Parables of Jesus

Children will understand why Christians believe that stories Jesus told are important. They will read a selection of different parables and understand what they teach about life and about the nature of God.

THEME

Theme name: Around the World

Subject Drivers: Geography

The children will learn how to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body in **Science**. They will also be able to say what part of the body is associated with each sense. Pupils will also be taught how to identify and describe a variety of common animals. In **Geography**, the children will learn about a variety of countries from different continents. The children will be able to identify daily weather patterns in the UK, and identify hot and cold areas around the world. The children will also learn about key physical & human features of the local area. In **Music** the children will listen to, and learn, songs from the various countries that we study. The children will learn about behaviour in **PSHE**, including class rules, respecting others' needs, listening and feelings. In **DT**, the children will learn where food comes from. They will also learn how to work safely and hygienically with food.
