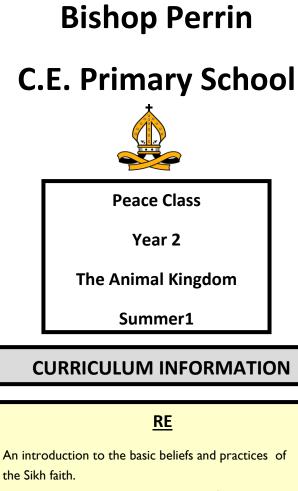

### **THEME**

Theme name: The Animal Kingdom Subject Driver: Science

In **Science**, children will be learning about how animals obtain their food and they will sort animals into different groups based on their food sources. They will learn about simple food chains. They will also identify animals in micro-habitats and learn how living things depend on each other. In **PSHE** they will learn about respecting the needs of ourselves and others. In History they will learn about the lives of significant people who have worked with animals, including David Attenborough and Jane Goodall. In Art the children will be creating animal prints. They will also look at some of Picasso's work and draw pictures inspired by his art. For Music lessons this term the children will learn to use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.
