- Children will be exploring the idea and meaning of belonging to a church or other religious community

#### **THEME**

Theme name: There's No Place like Home

Subject Driver: Science

In **Science** the children will be looking at the habitats of different plants and animals. They will compare different habitats and learn about the conditions in those habitats.
