Reading:

Sentence structure: Expressing time and clause using conjunctions (e.g. when, before, after, while, because), adverbs (e.g. then, next, soon), or prepositions (e.g. before, after, during, in, because of).

CURRICULUM INFORMATION

RE

Children will learn about the Anglican Church from a local/diocesan perspective and a National/International level.

Children will also learn about the role of different people within the Easter narrative. They will consider their emotions and the impact that they had on the lives of others.

THEME

Theme name: Egyptology

Subject Driver: History

In this theme in **History**, children will learn about the achievements of the earliest civilisations and study in depth the ancient Egyptians. Children will learn to ask perceptive questions to deepen their understanding and understand methods of historical enquiry by learning to think critically about evidence and artefacts. In **Science**, children will be investigating forces. They will report on findings from enquiries both orally and in writing and draw conclusions from their results. Children will develop an understanding of the history of **music**, explore graphic scores and explore minor scales through round singing. In **Art**, children will improve their mastery of sculpture, working with modelling materials to create an Egyptian death mask. They will create a death mask to explore working on creating different effects and textures with paint.
