The **Parables of Jesus**
Children will understand why Christians believe that stories Jesus told are important. They will read a selection of different parables and understand what they teach about life and about the nature of God.

THEME

Theme name: Me, Myself and I

Subject Drivers: History

The children will learn how to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body in **Science**. They will also be able to say what part of the body is associated with each sense. The children will be taught the importance of exercise, hygiene and healthy eating for humans. In **History**, the children will form an understanding of time and chronological order by learning about the history and changes of Bishop Perrin School. They will also learn about Florence Nightingale and her contribution to nursing. In **Music**, children will develop their listening skills and evaluate different pieces of music.

The children will be learning about what makes us special in **PSHE**, including respecting our similarities and differences. In **DT**, the children will learn where food comes from and how to work safely and hygienically with food.
