Children will learn about Easter symbols and the meaning of Easter for Christians.

THEME

Theme name: London Calling Subject Driver: Geography

In this theme, in **Geography** children will identify physical and human features of countries in the UK and they will learn that London is a capital city. They will learn about different landmarks and create a simple map of an area in London. In Art, children will study the work of Monet and Paul Klee. They will produce drawings and paintings of London in the style of different artists. In Science, children will learn about different life cycles and find out what animals need to survive.
