#### Year 5 & 6 Westminster Abbey Trip Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2026

Please note, children will be back at the slightly later time of 16:00 - 16:15, travelling via public transport to and from the venue.

Held in the beautiful garden of Westminster Abbey to explore the events, people and animals of Holy Week, this special event is brought to you by Wintershall Education, in partnership with Westminster Abbey. The Wintershall team enable schools to use Biblical drama and the arts to 'experience the story' of Christianity. Costumed interpreters lead this interactive session, allowing students to 'meet' people from the Easter story and stroke a donkey, like the one who carried Jesus. Students will be invited to sit around the table laid for the Last Supper; hear from Peter, Jesus' close friend; and stand with the Roman soldier who saw it all. Make this the year your students really engage with the true meaning and significance of the remarkable story of Easter.

#### THE MEATBALLS

- 1 onion, diced
- 2 carrots, diced
- 200g mushrooms, chopped
- 1 aubergine, diced
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 1 tsp Italian herbs
- 3 slices/2 slices thick bread (for breadcrumbs) • 2 tbsps tomato puree
- 1 tin kidney beans or similar
- THE SAUCE • 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove garlic, finely chopped
- 1 X 400g tin of tomatoes
- · 2tsps Italian herbs
- 900ml water\*
- veg/olive oil\*

#### THE PASTA

- 350g pasta
- veg/olive oil\*
- Salt and pepper\*

#### STEP ONE - THE VEGGIEBALLS

- · Finely dice the carrots, 1 onion, mushrooms, aubergine & 1 clove of
- garlic.

   Gently fry the onion and carrot for 3-4 mins in a little oil, then add the mushroom, aubergine, garlic and 1 tsp of the herbs and cook gently for a further 6-7 mins.

· Grate the slices of bread to make breadcrumbs. Folding the bread to

make a thicker piece to hold on to.

• Put the breadcrumbs in a large bowl.

#### STEP FIVE - THE SAUCE

- Add some oil to a frying pan, finely chop the onion and garlic and fry for 3-4 minutes.
- Add in the tomato puree, tinned tomatoes, 150ml water, and Italian herbs and season with salt and pepper.
- Mix together well and fry the mixture for another 5 minutes, stirring regularly. 10



#### STEP SIX

- Boil the kettle and add 750ml boiling water to the sauce.
- Stir the pasta into the sauce, and simmer for 5 mins with the lid on.
- Cook the pasta and sauce for a further 8-9 mins, without the lid. Stir occasionally.



#### STEP SEVEN

Meanwhile gently fry your veggie balls for 7-8 mins, turning as they golden.



#### STEP EIGHT

· Serve your veggie balls on a plate of pasta and sauce. Enjoy!





### STEP THREE

STEP TWO

- · Drain the tin of beans and add to the breadcrumbs.
- · Mix together, roughly mashing the beans with a fork.

#### STEP FOUR

- · Mix the vegetables in with the bean and breadcrumb mixture and season with salt and pepper.
- Using your hands, divide and shape the mixture into 20 similar sized balls.


