Dear Parents and Carers,

Well done to all our Year 6 pupils who have taken part in Bikeability this week. We've had very positive feedback from the instructors about their behaviour, their safety-conscious attitude while out on the road, and showing much resilience in the challenging conditions during this freezing cold weather. We're delighted that they have had this opportunity to learn new skills and develop their safety awareness when out cycling.

On Wednesday, we welcomed David Tan (our new School Improvement Partner), into school for his autumn term visit. He met with me, Miss McAvoy and Miss Sweeney, to talk about the school context for this year, and we did a learning walk during which we popped into all the classes to see how the children are getting on in their English lessons. We were very impressed by the learning behaviours the children were showing, being engaged in their lessons, actively participating in discussions and producing some high-quality writing.

School Trips Payments / Permissions

Year 5 & 6 Westminster Abbey Trip Thursday 26th February 2026

Please note, children will be back at the slightly later time of 16:00 - 16:15, travelling via public transport to and from the venue.

Held in the beautiful garden of Westminster Abbey to explore the events, people and animals of Holy Week, this special event is brought to you by Wintershall Education, in partnership with Westminster Abbey. The Wintershall team enable schools to use Biblical drama and the arts to 'experience the story' of Christianity. Costumed interpreters lead this interactive session, allowing students to 'meet' people from the Easter story and stroke a donkey, like the one who carried Jesus. Students will be invited to sit around the table laid for the Last Supper; hear from Peter, Jesus' close friend; and stand with the Roman soldier who saw it all. Make this the year your students really engage with the true meaning and significance of the remarkable story of Easter.

- 2 tbsps vegetable oil*
- 8 Veggie Sausages
- 2 carrots, sliced thinly
- 2 onions, finely chopped
- 1 pepper, deseeded & chopped
- 1 tbsp tomato puree
- 1 tbsp cajun seasoning
- 50ml water*
- 400g tin of chopped tomatoes
- 400g tin of baked beans
- 5 Baking potatoesSalt & Pepper*

STEP ONE

- Pre-heat the oven to 190C / 170C fan / Gas mark 5.
- Wash the baking potatoes and put into the oven (directly onto shelf) to bake for 50-60 mins
- · Chop the onions and peppers and thinly slice the carrots.



STEP FIVE

- · Add the tomatoes and water and stir in well.
- Bring to a simmer.



STEP TWO

• Heat 2 tbsps oil in the frying pan, add the onion, peppers & carrot and fry on a medium heat for 5-7 minutes to soften.

STEP SIX

· Stir in the baked beans.

Bring to a simmer and then cover with a lid or foil to simmer gently for 15-20 mins mins.



STEP THREE

• Turn up the heat slightly , add the sausages and fry until browned all over.



STEP SEVEN

- Prick the potatoes several times with a fork and cook in the microwave on high for 10 minutes.
- Turn them over and microwave on high for a further 4-5 mins until soft.
- · Crisp up under Grill at 200C or gas Mark 6 for 5 Minutes.





STEP FOUR

 Push the sausages to one side and stir the tomato puree and Cajun seasoning into the vegetables, cook for 2 mins.



STEP EIGHT

· Spoon the smoky sausage mixture over the potatoes and enjoy!
