Headteacher's Hello

Dear parents and carers,

It was lovely to see so many of you at the Whitton Lights event last weekend. Our school choir, supported by Mrs Place, gave a wonderful performance of some festive songs and carols and did a brilliant job of entertaining the crowd. We were very proud of them all.

Well done to our Year 5 & 6 boys' football team who attended the borough football tournament on Wednesday. They put in a huge amount of effort and played well, showing good sportspersonship throughout. Thank you to Miss Holloway, Miss Poole and Mrs James who accompanied the children.

Today, parents and carers of all children in Year 2, and some of the children in Year 4 and 5 will receive a letter about swimming arrangements for next term. If you receive a letter, your child will be going swimming. If your child is in Year 4 or 5 and you do not receive a letter, an alternative PE lesson will be happening at the same time for them at school. Whilst it would be our preference to be able to provide swimming lessons for all children, high costs and limiting constraints of the school timetable mean that we have to prioritise who attends these lessons. Since Covid, the priority is to ensure that all children can self-rescue, followed by aiming to reach the National Curriculum requirement to be able to swim 25m. If your child can already do these things that is fantastic and they have already aquired an essential, life-saving skill. In the interests of inclusivity, and to ensure we give the best possible chance for all the children to aquire this skill, we have prioritsed swimming lessons for those who need the extra support to achieve this. Thank you for your understanding.

We will need two volunteers to accompany the Year 2 class on the coach to and from their swimming lessons. If you can volunteer your time on a Monday morning between 9.30 - 11am, please let the school office know. Your time would be very much appreciated.

We are looking forward to our first School Association Bishop Perrin School Christmas fair on Thursday 19th December. A lot of organisation is going on behind the scenes to facilitate this event and we're grateful to all the volunteers who are working hard to make this happen. This is a closed event, meaning it is only open to children and their parent / carers of Bishop Perrin School. Children are to be accompanied by an adult to this event, and supervised by them at all times – the SA volunteers or school staff will not be responsible for supervision at this event. If your child usually walks home from school and they would like to attend the fair, please make arrangements for an adult to pick them up from school and accompany them to the fair. Please ensure this has been communicated to the class teacher, so they know they can release their child to this adult. Children will not be allowed to attend the event unaccompanied.

Thank you to everyone who bought a poppy from school in honour of Remembrance Day this year. Bishop Perrin School collected £113.81 for the Poppy Appeal 2024. A fantastic amount!

We have recruited a new class teacher to our staff team for January. Mrs Sarah English will be job-sharing with Mrs Crinall in Year 5. Mrs English will teach Year 5 on a Monday, and Mrs Crinall on Tuesday – Friday. We look forward to welcoming Mrs English to our school.

Finally, congratulations to Miss McAvoy who has been awarded a distinction in her studies for the National Award in Special Educational Needs Coordination. A very well-deserved recognition of all the hard work and dedication that Miss McAvoy demonstrates in her role.

School Trips Payments / Permissions

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). Children should bring a bag (school bag or other) to carry their packed lunch and water bottle in. Packed lunches should not contain any form of nuts (this applies to children and adult volunteers); no fizzy drinks or glass bottles. If details vary to this they will be provided below within the specific trip section.

Year 1 Trip to Windsor Castle

Year 1 will be visiting Windsor Castle on Friday, 31st January, where they will explore the historic site, learn about its significance, and take part in activities that complement their classroom learning. Further details will be shared as soon as they are available.

Year 2 Trips

Due to a lack of suitable workshops being available for this term, Year 2 will be taking part in an online workshop about The Great Fire of London, run by Kew Archives, after Christmas. Plans are also in place to book trips to the London Transport Museum and The Roald Dahl Museum for next year.

Year 3 trip to Stonehenge

Year 3 will be visiting Stonehenge on Tuesday, 10th December, where they will learn about early British history, explore the famous stone circle, and take part in interactive activities to support their classroom learning.

Please ensure children arrive at school by 8:00 am, as the coach will depart promptly at 8:15 am. The cost of this trip is £13.80. Please log in to your child's SCOPAY account to complete permission and payment for this trip. Please ensure your child wears school uniform, a waterproof/warm coat, and brings a snack and packed lunch. The children are due back at school by the 3.15pm.

Faith Ambassadors from Year 3-6

On the 30th January, the Faith Ambassadors from Year 3-6 will attend the LDBS Annual Service at St Paul's Cathedral. The service is from 2-2.45pm and we will be travelling by train and tube. We will be leaving school at around midday. Children will need to bring a packed lunch that can be eaten on the train (preferably with rubbish then disposed of to prevent having to carry bags into the cathedral so everything needs to be disposable.) Children will also need to bring a water bottle (also

preferably disposable). Due to the finish time of the service, we will not return to school until 4.15-4.30pm. Please provide consent via SCOPAY.

Whole School

The whole school will be attending a Christmas pantomime, Cinderella, at The Exchange, Twickenham, on Wednesday, 18th December 2024, at 1pm.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will travel to the theatre in a coach. Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 will travel by train. The cost of the pantomime tickets have been subsidised by funds kindly donated by the School Association. The cost of the trip will be more for those travelling by coach to accommodate the additional cost of coach travel: train travel is free. All children will return to school after the performance, due back at approximately 3:45pm.

Year 6 Bikeability

Year 6 will be completing their bikeability training next week. Please ensure that they bring their bikes and helmets in on Monday if they are taking part. They also need to be wearing PE kit and wear suitable warm/waterproof clothing.

Safeguarding, Wellbeing & Inclusion Flu and Norovirus

With flu and norovirus cases on the rise, here are four simple steps to help keep your child healthy this winter.

- 1. Teach good hygiene habits: Encourage children to wash their hands regularly and use a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes to stop the spread of germs.
- 2. Know when to keep your child at home: Children can still attend school with symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough, but should stay home if they have a high temperature, diarrhoea and vomiting. Read NHS guidance to help vou decide.
- 3. Stop the spread of stomach bugs: Stomach bugs spread easily in schools. If you or your child have diarrhoea and vomiting, wash hands with soap and warm water regularly and clean surfaces with bleach-based products. Keep children away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 48 hours.
- Get vaccinated: All school-aged children are eligible 4 for a free nasal spray flu vaccine, which is painless and quick to administer. An injectable vaccine is also available for some children, such as children that cannot consume pork gelatine. The South London Children and Young People's Community Immunisation Service (CYPCIS) are attending schools to provide flu vaccinations.

If your child misses their school vaccination session, you can visit a community clinic. For more information, visit the CYPCIS website.

Subsidised sensory packs

If you are eligible, you may be able to apply for a subsided sensory pack yo support your child with autism or sensory needs. Please visit the Caudwell Children website for further information.
