Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

We held a very productive Parent Forum meeting this morning with some important points raised for discussion. My thanks to all the parent reps who came along to the meeting and gathered feedback from the parent and carer community which facilitated our discussion. Minutes will be circulated in due course.

Last week, the boys' football team participated in the borough football tournament and yesterday our girls' football team took part in a league match against Heathfield School. You can find out more details of both events in our sports report later in the newsletter. We are proud of all of our footballers who showed excellent sportspersonship and enthusiasm playing in wet and muddy conditions. Thanks to Miss Murray and Miss Gunter for their support with facilitating these opportunities for the children.

Next week is assessment week for the children. It is important for children to be in school every day that they are well enough so they do not miss the opportunity to demonstrate the progress they have made with their learning this term. So you are aware, we do not refer to the children doing tests to avoid unnecessary anxiety, but rather assessment activities to show-off their learning.

Today, children in Year 5 will be bringing home a letter about a project they will taking part in next term with charity 'Action Breaks Silence'. The aim of the project is to support children to identify harmful behaviours and how to set boundaries; be empowered to stand up for themselves and others where boundaries are not respected. Please read the letters and complete the permission slip and return to school. If you have any questions about this project, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Good luck to our school choir who will be singing at St. Augustine's Church Christmas Fair tomorrow. The fair is on from 12 – 3pm, and our choir will be performing at 2pm. My thanks to Miss McAvoy who will be going along to support the choir at the fair.

As we enter the last two weeks of term, please keep an eye on the newsletter as it is a busy time of year and there is a lot going on. A reminder that even though it is drawing towards the end of term, children are still expected to be in school all day, every day that they are well enough to be. We have noticed an increasing number of children being picked up early from school recently. Early pick-ups are very disruptive to the children's learning and the afternoon's activities, and should only be in the case of a medical reason, or exceptional circumstances. Thank you for your coperation with this.

Excitement is building ahead of the SA Christmas discos this evening! Thank you to the SA volunteers for all their hard work in making this opportunity happen – I hope the children have a wonderfully festive time and a thoroughly enjoyable evening.

Absence due to illness - sickness and diarrhea

Children should be in school everyday that they are well enough. If a child has vomited or has diarrhea, they must not return to school for 48 hours after the last bout, to avoid spreading the illness bug to others. We have a lot of sickness going around at the moment, so it is vital that parents and carers adhere to this 48-hour rule for the benefit of themselves and others — thank you. Reporting Reasons for Absence

We are appreciative when parents inform us promptly of the reasons for their child's absence as this helps us to maintain our reporting systems efficiently. We also appreciate the honesty regarding the reasons why. Inevitably, staff will hear from the children themselves if they have been / going on holiday or having a day out during school time, and it puts staff and children in a difficult position if this absence has been reported as an illness / medical issue. Ideally, refraining from taking holidays, days out or picking up from school early for excursions during term time will avoid this uncomfortable situation from occurring and it will mean we can avoid having to start asking for proof of all medical appointments in future. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

In collective worship this week...

This week in collective worship we talked about the start of the Advent season. We discussed how at this time of year, it can be easy to be distracted by all the business and preparation for Christmas, but how it's also important to have some calm and quiet time to reflect and remember the true meaning of Christmas.

Ingredients
300g potatoes
2 cloves gartic
1 tsp oil
½ tsp ooriander seeds
½ tsp oorinin seeds
425g can tomatoes
1 tsp turmeric
1 inch root ginger
1 tsp chilli powder
½ tsp ground cinnamon
1 tsp dhanno jeera powder (half coriander powder)
300a frozen pass

Young Carers

Young carers are children and young people under the age of 18 who are taking on practical and/or emotional caring responsibilities normally expected of an adult, and can include anything from cooking, shopping and housework to administering medication, assisting with personal care such as washing or dressing, interpreting, physical support such as lifting and even emotional support or looking after younger siblings.

If your child is a young carer a referral can be made via <u>Richmond Carers Centre</u> who can provide one-to-one mentoring; information, advice and support; and access to a range of extra-curricular and enriching activities.

Please see Miss McAvoy for further information. If your child is a young carer and school are not yet aware, please also be in touch.







Chorister for a Day is a wonderful opportunity for girls and boys aged 6-8 (Yrs 2-3 at school) and their parents and carers to experience a day as a chorister in our world-famous choir of children and professional adult singers. New choristers typically join the choir at the start of Year 4 and this event is designed to help potential choristership applicants find out more about life as a chorister ahead of auditions in February. The programme of events will include various activities, ending with the Chorister for a Day participants taking part in Choral Evensong with the Choir of St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle.





Choristers at St George's rehearse every weekday morning and sing services on four weekdays and on a Sunday (Saturdays are mostly commitment free). This schedule develops not only their musical talents, but nurtures key skills such as leadership, team work, and time management. The Choristers are educated and board part-time at St George's School on generous scholarships, and limited means-tested bursaries may be available. The choristers all receive singing lessons from one of the UK's finest teachers of young voices, and receive instrumental and theory tuition. More information on all aspects of being a chorister will be available at Choristerfor a Day.

The Choir was founded in 1348, and is now a choir of mixed girland boy choristers and adult by clerks (both male and female who provide the alto, tenorand bass parts). The choir sings regularly in the presence of His Majesty the Kingand other members of the Royal family, at annual events such as Garter Day and Easter Sunday Mattins, and at special events.

In 2018, this included singing at both Royal Weddings in St George's Chapel: for The Duke and Duchess of Sussex in May, and for HRH Princess Eugenie and Mr Jack Brooksbank in October. In September 2022 the choir sang at the Committal Service for Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in St George's Chapel. The choir released a CD of Christmas music in 2019 on the Hyperion label which was met with critical acclaim, and a recording with the Band of the Household Cavalry was released in November 2022. The choir has also broadcast on radio, most recently in May 2024 with Choral Evensong (BBC Radio 3), and given concerts in the Windsor Festival and the Thaxted Festival.



It is important to note that we are not looking for musical stars at this stage — we are looking for children between the ages of six and eight who have the potential to develop their fledgling musical talent, who would like to consider the opportunity of applying for a choristership, and above all who would enjoy this sort of event.


