### **School News & Attendance**

#### Clubs

**Film Club** - Two spaces have become available at Tuesday's Film Club (3:15 – 4:00pm) for children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. If you would like to secure a place for your child please do so via SCOPAY, this will be on a first come first served basis.

#### **Morning Activity Club**

Back in the summer term, our Breakfast Club provision was paused as it was no longer financially viable and we were struggling to staff it. Last term, we looked into various ways to address this:

- Survey of parents to establish numbers likely to attend Breakfast Club on a regular basis
- We approached Koosa Kids to see if they would run a Breakfast Club for us – our attendance numbers did not meet their minimum threshold
- We redesigned our club provision to a Morning Activity Club and re-advertised over the Christmas holidays (closing date 15.1.24) – we have had no applicants

Unfortunately, despite our efforts to find a way to introduce a form of care for children before school, it hasn't been possible. If we don't have the staff, we cannot run the club. I know this will be frustrating for a number of parents, and I apologise for that. The local authority are currently carrying out a survey of parents in the borough to gauge the need for wrap-around care, I urge you to complete the <u>survey</u> in the hope that a local provision will be available for September 2024.



#### **Attendance**
