## Filtering and Monitoring at school

In line with the expectations of [Keeping Children Safe in Education \(KCSIE\) 2023](#), we have the facility to filter the access children have to websites when they are using school devices and to monitor what they are accessing. This is checked routinely by the Senior Leadership Team and individual cases where children have either accidentally, or deliberately accessed content that is not suitable is reviewed and addressed with the child and their parents for follow up at home.

Each case is looked at on an individual basis to ensure that context is considered to establish what is appropriate for children of different ages. Where content is required for their learning, for example in PSHE, children in Year 6 may have the need to use specific search terms that relate to alcohol and drugs that would otherwise be restricted, context is considered. Blocked websites are reviewed and can be added to or removed as appropriate. Please take measures yourself to ensure that the content children can access on home devices is appropriate and safe using advice on the [Online Safety](#) page of the school website.

## Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

In June, all children in Year 4 will complete the statutory MTC which is carried out online with each child completing a short interactive assessment on a Chromebook. Miss Murray is working with children to develop their knowledge and understanding of multiplication tables. Please support your child at home to practise regularly to increase their fluency and automaticity of recall. For resources to support the learning of multiplication tables, please see the maths page on the school website. The more fluent children are in their timestables, the more confident they can be as mathematicians. Year 4 parents will receive some specific information about the check alongside the newsletter this week. Please see Miss Murray or Miss McAvoy with any questions or concerns.

## NSPCC Number Day

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in the United Kingdom for NSPCC Number Day. The competition runs from 07:30 to 19:30 GMT on Friday 2nd February. It's all done online via play.trockstars.com.

Children can play in any gamemode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a 60-minute limit (see below). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player well-being, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means, encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans. Certificates will be awarded in Celebration Worship on Friday 9th February.
