## Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely to see so many of you at parent consultations this week – thank you for coming along. We hope you valued the opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher to hear about your child's progress, and to look at their work in their books. Thank you to the staff for all their hard work to facilitate these meetings. In the summer term, instead of parent meetings with the class teacher, you will receive a written report detailing your child's progress over the course of the academic year and you will have the opportunity to come into school during the day to see your child while they are learning and to look at their books during Open School.

I sent a letter out at the start of term regarding road safety around the school. We have noticed an improvement in this, however an issue remains concerning children being dropped off at the junction of the Ashley Drive slip-road and Hospital Bridge Road close to the school gate. Please refrain from stopping here so as to maintain a clear, safe sightline for children crossing the road. The following is from the council website:

### ***School 'keep clear' markings***

*The yellow zig-zag markings often found near schools are there for safety reasons. They are designed to warn motorists that stopping would cause a danger to children and pedestrians. The restriction times are as shown on nearby yellow time plates and while they are in force, motorists must not stop for any reason, including setting down or picking up passengers or loading / unloading goods. ## School Trips Payments / Permissions

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). Packed lunches should not contain any form of nuts (this applies to children and adult volunteers); no fizzy drinks or glass bottles. In the summer term, if the children are likely to be outside during their visit, please ensure that you apply sunscreen before they come to school and they wear a hat. ### Parental Responsibility – important update

Having parental responsibility means you have legal rights and duties relating to your children's upbringing.

If you have parental responsibility, your most important roles are to:

- provide a home for the child
- protect and maintain the child

You're also responsible for:

- disciplining the child
- choosing and providing for the child's education
- agreeing to the child's medical treatment
- naming the child and agreeing to any change of name
- looking after the child's property

You have to ensure that your child is supported financially, whether you have parental responsibility or not.

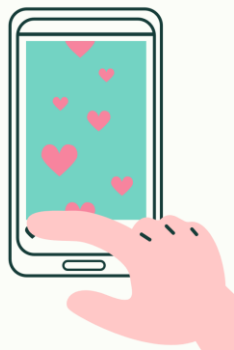
