#### **School Trips Payments / Permissions**

#### **Fostering with Achieving for Children**



achieving for children

Children and young people can come into local authority care for lots of reasons. Usually, this happens when their parents can't look after them because of drug, alcohol or mental health problems, or there's been a family crisis. Fostering is a way of providing a short-term home for a child until a permanent solution is found, although how long they'll be in foster care for isn't always known.

AfC need foster carers from all walks of life to look after children of differing ages, from babies to teenagers up to the age of 18. Many different kinds of people can provide a secure and caring environment for children and young people who cannot live with their families. Age, income, gender, sexuality, marital status and culture do not affect a person's ability to be a good carer. It is your personal qualities that matter. #### **Acceptable Use Policies**

Children have been reminded of our Acceptable Use Policies when using devices at school. It is strongly advised that you familiarise yourself with these expectations and reinforce similar messages at home to prevent misuse of technology or unkind behaviour online towards or between children. These are displayed in classrooms and routinely referred to when children use devices such as Chromebooks at school as part of their learning.

#### **School Nursing Team**

- Supporting children at risk
- Supporting those experiencing emotional difficulties or mental health problems
- Weight management and obesity prevention (includes the National Child Measurement Programme)
- Building strong, supportive relationships with local schools
- Close working with GPs and other health services, the Council, Achieving for Children and the voluntary sector

#### **Lego Therapy**

#### Cases of chickenpox in school
