## Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday, we were treated to a wonderful class assembly by Year 3, filled with singing, acting and creative artwork. The children did a fantastic job of teaching us about the Stone Age, and sharing all the learning they had done last half term. Thank you to Miss Gunter, Mrs Hussein and all the staff involved in helping the children prepare for their assembly.

Yesterday, Year 4 visited Hampton Court Palace as part of their learning about 'The Tudors in London'. I heard many positive reports about the day, with the experience very much enhancing the children's learning and understanding about this history topic. Thank you to Miss Sweeney and the staff and parents who accompanied the children on this visit.

You may have heard in the news this week the announcement from the Education Secretary, Bridget Phillipson, stating that schools should be phone-free environments for the entire school day, including breaktimes and lunchtimes, and that Ofsted will now examine both mobile phone policies and their application during a school inspection. We have had a policy for this in place since September, that we only allow children in Year 5 & 6 who walk to school to have a mobile phone in school (at their own risk – the school is not responsible if the phone is lost or damaged), but it must not be a smartphone. Our policy states the phone must be switched off and placed in their bag before entering the school premises, and not accessed again until they have left the school site – children should not be using their phones in the playground after school. Any pupils found using their phone during the day will have it confiscated. Our current system operates on a foundation of trust and responsibility, that the children abide by these rules and are responsible about their phone use. This has been very successful so far and we have found the children to be very responsive to this. We acknowledge and appreciate the maturity of the children in managing this, and the support and cooperation of the parents.

You may have noticed some police officers outside of school at drop-off time this morning. Please be reassured there was nothing to worry about. They are keeping an eye on the parking and safe road use around the school. You will be aware from my previous communications this month, that this is something we have raised concerns about and it is helpful to have their support with this.

## School News

### World Book Day – Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2026

World Book Day is on Thursday 5th March this year. As usual, we will be celebrating in school by encouraging the children to read a brand new book. We ask that all children choose a book from the list attached with this newsletter. These books have all been shortlisted for the [SPARK! Book Awards 2026](#).

The children will read their chosen book at home in advance of World Book Day. On the day, they can come to school either dressed as a character or bring in a prop, inspired by their chosen book. During the day, they will gather with all the other children who have chosen to read the same book as them, along with a member of staff, for a book club discussion and activity.

Local libraries are supporting the SPARK! Book Awards, so you will be able to find copies of the books there. We will also have some copies in school for the children to borrow nearer the time. We will ask the children to let us know which book they have chosen by the end of the week, Friday 27th February, so we can make arrangements for World Book Day.

## Outdoor Play and Learning at Bishop Perrin

We recently asked our student council representatives to carry out a survey to find out what they thought of our playground and the activities/resources on offer. We also asked them what new activities/resources they would like to see in the future. We are hoping to provide some of the resources but will need support from our parent community.

It has been shown that having a range of activities available has a positive influence on behaviour at playtimes which then feeds in to a calmer and more productive transition back into class for lessons, as well as improving pupils' wellbeing.

High on the list were:

- Arts and crafts
- Role-play resources
- Dress-up/props for acting
- Lego
- Small vehicles such as toy cars, trains, planes etc
- Sports – 4 square, football and basketball/netball – which we already provide

As this is a big project to undertake, we are going to implement some of these changes in stages.

### Stage 1: Arts and Crafts/Games

- We would be extremely grateful if you are able to send in/donate the following:
- Crayons (can be lightly used but not broken)
- Pencils/colouring pencils (can be lightly used but not broken)
- Washable felt-tip pens (if not new, then in good useable condition)
- Chalk

- Stamps and ink pads
- Origami books/paper
- Uno cards/Top Trumps cards
- Chess sets

- Mark as "Not Junk": Open the junk folder, select the email, and click "Not Junk" or "Report Not Spam".
- Add to Safe Senders/Contacts/Favourites/Vip's: Add the sender's email address or domain to your contacts or Safe Senders list in your email settings.
- Create Filters/Rules: Set up a filter to always keep messages from specific senders out of spam and in your inbox.
- Check Blocked Senders: Ensure the sender isn't accidentally on your blocked list.

## School Trips Payments / Permissions

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). ## Kingston & Richmond Safeguarding Children Partnership (KRSCP) River Safety

Given the recent weather conditions and the likelihood of further cold spells, KRSCP are asking us to promote water safety messages to our school community. This effort aims to reduce the risk of drowning both in the home and within the community.

Going into the river or on ice is extremely dangerous. Cold water shock, a primary precursor to drowning, can occur in water temperatures below 15°C. The River Thames typically drops to between 3°C and 9°C (37°F – 48°F) during January and February. If someone experiences cold water shock, they should float on their back rather than attempting to swim. 
