Pupil Progress in the Juniors

Starting this term, pupils in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be bringing home tests papers, which have been completed at school. This will include weekly times table tests and incorrect spellings, which they will record in their homework diaries so that parents/carers can keep track of pupil progress. In December, children will sit assessments in reading, writing, SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and maths; these papers will also be sent home once they have been marked and results recorded.
