Face Coverings

As of next week (Monday), we are politely requesting that parents, carers and anyone who comes onto the school site, especially at pick-up time, wears a face covering. We have noticed that parents are not using the yellow 2m social distancing markers along the pathway to the playground whilst queuing to collect their children at pick up time. As a school community, we need to be mindful that there are some parents who have underlying health conditions, and if socially distancing isn't being adhered to, we are increasing the risk for vulnerable people using the school site. If you can view coming onto the school site as if you were going into a shop, and use a face covering, it would help instil confidence and reduce anxiety across the school community. We appreciate that there will be some parents who cannot wear face masks for medical reasons, so other parents should be respectful of this. Thank you for your help and co-operation of this.

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Covid Testing of Bishop Perrin Pupils

Some children have had to undertake Covid-19 tests this week and thankfully, to date, they have all come back as negative. We are aware that there have been issues for some parents in organising tests for their children and their family as some local sites have been inundated with testing appointments. The Government have asked schools across the country to stress to their parents that they should only seek to have their children tested if they are exhibiting one or more of the following symptoms:

- A high temperature
- A new, continuous cough
- A loss or change of their sense of taste or smell

If your child has taken a Covid-19 test, please make sure you inform us of the result, be it negative or positive, by sending the confirmation email you will receive with the results.

What to do if you are notified of a positive test result over the weekend

In the event that a child returns with a positive test result and you are notified about this on either a Saturday or Sunday, it is imperative that you notify the school. This is so we can then seek advice and guidance from the South London Health Protection Team as to our next steps. It might be that we have to close a class down before they come into school on a Monday. In order for parents to notify us of the positive results, the info@bishopperrin.richmond.sch.uk email account will be checked at 5pm on both Saturday and Sunday. Therefore we are asking parents to email us the confirmation email you receive notifying you of a positive result as soon as possible. We would ask that you do not notify other parents in your child's class about the positive test result as we will inform the whole class of the next steps that need to be taken based on the advice we receive from the South London Health Protection Team.

Thank you for all your patience and understanding this week about all the tweaks and updates to our protocols and procedures. We appreciate how much information there is for you to digest at present, and our hope is that things will settle down soon and we can all start to get into a consistent routine. However, as we're all aware, there can sometimes be some rapid changes in guidance from the Government which we then have to react to and share with you.

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Autumn Term Parent Interview Format

In order to minimise the number of contacts coming into the school building, we will not be holding face-to-face Parent Interviews this term. In place of the formal faceto-face meetings, we will be offering parents the opportunity to join in a live "Meet the Teacher" session during the week beginning the 28th September, followed up during the week beginning 5th October with a 5 minute phone call to each family. Parents of children who are on the school's Special Educational Needs Register will have the opportunity of an extended phone call if they wish.

The "Meet the Teacher" session will be an opportunity for your child's teacher to share expectations, timetables and routines with you. We will be inviting parents to send in general questions that they would like answered prior to the sessions which the teachers will then answer for them. The teachers will prepare a document that will be sent to all parents of children in their class in case some parents aren't able to join the "live" session. We hope that this format will help answer lots of common and generic questions, thus leaving the follow up phone call the following week for a more focused conversation about how your child has settled into school and any other specific issues to discuss.

The "live" session will held using Google Meet, which is an online video conferencing platform. If you are not familiar with Google Meet, and you intend to be able to join in with your class session, please click through here to see how you can access it: https://apps.google.com/meet/?hs=197

Prior to the "live" session, we will send out a code that will allow you to join the meeting. The live sessions will all be at separate times so that parents can join in meetings if they have children in different classes. With regards the phone calls, we will offer parents a range of times (one hour blocks) when your child's class teacher will phone you to talk to you.

We hope this format to the Parent Interviews will be informative and convenient to everyone under the restrictive circumstances that we are working under. Please look out for a separate email with more details over the next two weeks.
