Attendance

World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March this year. As usual, we will be celebrating in school by encouraging the children to read a brand-new book. We ask that all children choose a book from the list detailed further on in this newsletter. These books have all been shortlisted for the SPARK! Book Awards 2024.


The children will read their chosen book at home in advance of World Book Day. On the day they can come to school either dressed as a character or bring in a prop, inspired by their chosen book. During the day, they will gather with all the other children who have chosen to read the same book as them, along with a member of staff, for a book club discussion and activity.

Local libraries are supporting the SPARK! Book Awards, so you will be able to find copies of these books there. We will also have some copies in school for the children to borrow, which will be available after half term.

We will ask the children to let us know which book they have chosen by the end of the week, Friday 23rd February, so we can make arrangements for World Book Day.

We also have author of Jessie and JoJo, "Mrs P", coming in to run some workshops with the children promoting positive strategies to deal with children's worries and highlighting the importance of friendships.

School Trips

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). Children should bring a bag (school bag or other) to carry their packed lunch and water bottle in. If details vary to this they will be provided below within the specific trip section.

Year 6

Bowles Activity Centre residential trip will take place between Monday 24th June and Friday 28th June 2024. If paying by instalments the third instalment is due today, 9th February 2024. Any remaining balance is due by all attendees, regardless of payment method, by Friday 8th March. Visit your child's SCOPAY account to make payment. We cannot extend this payment date as our final invoice is due the day after.

Year 5

Isle of Wight residential trip will take place between Tuesday 7th to Friday 10th May 2024. If paying by instalments the fourth instalment is due by 19th February 2024. <u>Any</u> <u>remaining balance is due by all attendees, regardless of</u> <u>payment method, by Friday 1st March.</u> Visit your child's SCOPAY account to make payment. We cannot extend this payment date as our final invoice is due the day after.

Morning drop-off

Some children have been observed getting out of their parent's car at drop-off in the morning whilst the car is stopped in the middle of the road. This is dangerous and if there is just one parent in the car, it is difficult to make sure their child gets in to school safely. We would much prefer that a child was a few minutes late getting in to school than being put at risk getting out of a car that has not parked safely.





Kids Eat Out For Less Day Out With The Kids February Half Term 2024

Morrisons - Kids under 16 eat for free at Morrisons Café when an adult spends £4.99 or more on a meal.

ASDA - Kids eat for £1 All Day, Every Day at Asda cafes, with no adult spend required.

Sainsbury's - Kids eat for £1 with purchase of an adult hot meal from £5.20. This offer is valid daily from 11:30am until the cafe closes.

Bella Italia - Kids Eat For £1 when an adult purchases a main meal between 4pm-6pm Mon-Thurs at Bella Italia. Dunelm - Kids Eat for Free when an adult spends £4 or more at Pausa Café.

YO Sushi - Kids Under 12 Eat for Free at YO Sushi between 12th - 23rd Feb (Mon-Fri) when an adult spends £10 or more.

Dobbies - Kids Eat for Free at Dobbies Garden Centre Cafés when an adult purchases a main meal.
