Headteacher's Hello

Dear parents and carers,

I hope you had a nice half term break.

It has been a rather eventful week at Bishop Perrin School to say the least. As you are aware, we received notification on Monday morning that we would be subject to a section 5 OFSTED inspection on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. The last time the school was inspected was in 2012, so we have been expecting the call for a while.

We had two HMI inspectors carry out the inspection, plus a senior HMI inspector who was here for quality assurance purposes. During their time here, the inspectors looked at the provision of the school in terms of quality of education; behaviour and attitudes; personal development; leadership and management; and Early Years. They spoke extensively to myself and Miss McAvoy as well as children, staff, parents, and governors. Amongst other things, they looked at a wide selection of children's books and visited numerous lessons and learning activities.

A report detailing the outcome of the inspection is currently being compiled. This can take several weeks, but we will share it with you as soon as it becomes available.

I'd like to say thank you to all the staff who have worked so hard this week and gone above and beyond to prepare for the inspection; to the children who welcomed our visitors into their classroom and talked to them about their work; to the governors for their support and to the parents for the huge number of responses to the parent survey. I'm aware many of you also took the time to talk to the inspectors when they were out at the school gate on Wednesday morning, so thank you for doing that. Thank you also for the all the kind messages of support and gifts of chocolates, cakes, and biscuits that have been arriving over the course of the week – these will keep us going until at least Easter! Your support and generosity are very much appreciated.

Despite the inspection, it has been business as usual this week with regards to the children's learning. We welcomed Mrs Crinall back to school from her maternity leave this week, and we also welcomed Miss Faith Mackey, our new PE coach, to our staff team. She has been getting to know the children in their PE lessons. Year 5 headed out to Whitton library on Tuesday, and on Monday it will be Year 1's turn.

The children have been telling me about the books they have chosen to read for World Book Day. Please see the list of books below. We are asking the children to select a book from the list to read in time for WBD on Thursday 7th March. We have a few copies of each of the books in school available to borrow if you're unable to get a copy.

Author Visit – Tuesday 5th March

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March this year. As usual, we will be celebrating in school by encouraging the children to read a brand-new book. We ask that all children choose a book from the list detailed further on in this newsletter. These books have all been shortlisted for the SPARK! Book Awards 2024.

The children will read their chosen book at home in advance of World Book Day. On the day they can come to school either dressed as a character or bring in a prop, inspired by their chosen book. During the day, they will gather with all the other children who have chosen to read the same book as them, along with a member of staff, for a book club discussion and activity.

Local libraries are supporting the SPARK! Book Awards, so you will be able to find copies of these books there. We will also have some copies in school for the children to borrow.
