# Richmond Music Trust Wider Opportunities – Woodwind Transition Stage

This term your child has taken part in the whole class instrumental stage of Richmond Music Trusts Wider Opportunities Programme – a short introduction to playing a woodwind instrument. We hope they have enjoyed the sessions, and would like to carry on learning.

The next stage in this programme is the Transition Stage and this runs for 20

Please note:

- Payment is required to complete your submission.
  - We need a minimum of 6 applications to run the Transition groups. If pupil numbers are insufficient, your child will have the option to move straight to our standard tuition we will contact you to confirm this is the case and organise any required credit/refund.
- In a small number of cases we may need to limit the number of places offered, due to the supply of instruments we have available. If we receive a large volume of applications, places will be allocated on a first come first serve basis.
