Safeguarding, Wellbeing & Inclusion



Next week is Neurodiversity Celebration Week. This week is an opportunity to kickstart a conversation with children about how our brains work and to begin (for some) to explore how this might affect them. We understand that all children are at different levels of understanding about neurodiversity, with reference to themselves, their families and in the wider world. The discussion at school will be tailored to each class with teachers approaching the conversation sensitively. If you have any concerns about how your child might interpret this information, please be in touch with their class teacher.

The two animations below will be shared with children in assembly on Monday. They look at different ways brains work and explain how we may all differ in our behaviours and understanding of the world. 
