Booking for Clubs

Log in to your child's SCOPAY account and click 'secure place' on your chosen club. Bookings for JA Sports, Joy for Languages and Code Camp are separate. To book these clubs please visit their websites as detailed on the clubs list email.

The number of clubs you can sign up for on SCOPAY will be limited initially to one per pupil. Parent/s have in the past signed up for more than one club using different email addresses. This is unfair. If this happens please note we will remove all bookings for that particular child.


