Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been another busy week in the life of Bishop Perrin School this week.

Online Safety – Messaging Apps

Over the past few weeks in school, we have been dealing with the fallout of a number of problems that have occurred outside of school time associated with pupils’ use of smartphones and apps for messaging amongst friendship groups. Incidences such as this how vulnerable children of primary age are to quickly getting out of their depth in the online messaging world as they have yet to develop the maturity and awareness of consequence to manage such complex situations independently.

The use of smartphones and messaging app access is a challenge all parents and carers navigate. Ellen Collins, the deputy headteacher from Turing House, gave a talk here last April, and again this January to parents to share her learning about how smartphones affect the mental health of young people. The resources from this talk are available on our website titled: [‘Phones, Social media and the Impact on Mental Health’](#). We encourage all parents and carers to take some time to look at these.

An analogy we have shared with the children in Year 6 is about the car (this comes from the book ‘The Anxious Generation’ by Jonathan Haidt’). When cars were first invented, there were few rules in places to protect drivers, passengers and pedestrians and to support safe use of the car. Over the years, technology, laws and expectations have changed significantly which means it is now much safer to drive a car. The same is true of mobile phones, smartphones and apps. Smartphone users are becoming more aware, technology companies are adapting and governments are reviewing laws. By changing our school policy to discourage smartphone use in children at primary school we have put in place a mechanism to support parents and carers to establish healthy boundaries whilst also enabling children to access technology safely. As of April 2024, the minimum age to access WhatsApp is 13 years old.

It is our school policy that children are not allowed to bring smartphones or smartwatches to school.

If your child has a smartphone at home, we encourage you to routinely (and frequently) look at your child’s phone messages and apps; to be curious rather than critical, about what is going on to make sure that the children are protected and supported to use their devices safely and positively.

This document, [Digital Parenting Advice](#) (available on our school website) is designed to support you to establish healthy routines and expectations around phone use for your children.

We can all learn from each other and having an open dialogue with our young people so that they feel able to share concerns with us, without judgement, is key for their longer term safety and wellbeing.




