Dear parents and carers,

We had an incredible response for the School Association EGM last night. Thank you to everyone who attended either in person or online, the support from the parent body was clearly evident. The new constitution was passed and the committee voted in. Thank you to the SA and Fr David for all the work that has gone on behind the scenes to get us to this point.

Following consultation with our pupils, parents, staff and governors, we have recently reviewed our school uniform policy. Thank you for your comments; we have taken them all into consideration. Whilst we are not able to accommodate all suggestions, you will see a number of changes based on the feedback we have received. This half term, the School Council have led a review of the names of our school houses. This week children, staff and parents have been voting for their preferred names. 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School uniform

Our new school uniform policy will be implemented from the start of next term. We encourage you to read it before purchasing any new items over the holidays. We very much appreciate your support in helping your child adhere to the policy. A few reminders that can help:

- No trainers please, unless it's a PE day
- No jewellery except for a wrist watch and single stud earrings (unless for religious reasons)
- Smart watches are not permitted

• Make-up and nail varnish are not permitted and children will be asked to remove it if they are wearing it to school

• Outdoor coats to be of a dark colour; hats and scarves to be plain and dark colour

• For health and safety reasons, long hair must always be tied back and hair accessories kept to a minimum and of school colours

• For safety reasons, children are not permitted to have key rings, bag tags or other accessories attached to their school bag other than reflective safety tags
