Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

Today, we have enjoyed our Easter service at St. Augustine's Church, celebrating Easter and all the children's achievements of the spring term. Thank you to everyone who came along to the church, it was lovely to see you there, and to Reverend Helen who led the service for us.

This week, the children in Year 1 – 6 have been doing some assessments in class to demonstrate the progress they have made in their learning this term. They have worked hard with their teachers and other staff, and results will be shared with you early in the new term.

On Tuesday, Year 1 – 6 visited Turing House to watch their production of Frozen. The children thoroughly enjoyed the performance and it was nice to see some familiar faces amongst the performers as past pupils from Bishop Perrin School. Yesterday, Year 3 enjoyed an Ancient Egypt Day, enhancing their learning about Ancient Egypt this term – they looked fabulous in their outfits!

You may be aware from the news that cases of measles in children are on the increase, which is a cause for concern. Please see later in the newsletter for ways in which you can protect your family, and what to do in the case of measles.

A reminder about safe driving / parking around school during drop-off and pick up times: this has been much improved since my original communications about this back in January, however, we were contacted earlier this week by one of our neighbours, whose drive was blocked by a car while children were being dropped off at school. There also continues to be some incidences of unsafe dropping off of children on the yellow zig-zag lines outside the school gate. The local police and council traffic law enforcement continue to stop by on occasions to monitor the situation. We ask for drivers' cooperation to find safe spaces to park for the safety and consideration of our local community.

We look forward to welcoming Mrs Place back to school after Easter. She has recovered well from her operation and will be back teaching Year 2 on Thursdays and Fridays, and teaching music to all classes on Wednesdays. This means we have to say a fond farewell to Mrs Parrish who has been teaching Year 2 throughout the spring term. We are incredibly grateful to Mrs Parrish for her hard work and for the consistency and stability she has given the children during Mrs Place's absence. Thank you Mrs Parrish, we will miss you and we wish you well in your new school.

Thank you for your support in what has been another successful and productive term at Bishop Perrin School. As we look ahead to the summer term please be aware our summer [school uniform](#) rules apply. The summer term is always a very busy one, so please keep an eye on the newsletter for details of upcoming events. We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday 13th April.

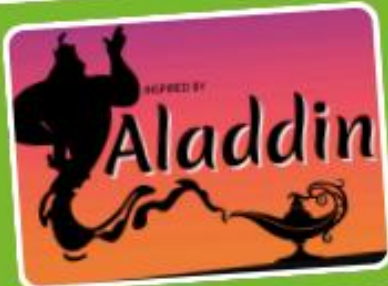
