Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

We were delighted to welcome The Mayor of Richmond, Cllr Penny Frost and her Chauffeur and Macebearer David, to school yesterday morning. Madam Mayor led an assembly for us in which the children learnt all about the role of the Mayor and they had the opportunity to ask lots of thoughtful and considered questions. It was a pleasure to show Madam Mayor and David around the school to meet the children and see the work they were doing. As always, the children did a wonderful job of representing our school, and we were very proud of them.

Yesterday, Reverend Helen joined Miss Lawrence, Miss McAvooy and me for an RE Learning Walk. We visited all the classes to see how RE is being taught across the school and we looked at a range of children's books. It was very rewarding to see how the children were approaching their learning about different world faiths with openness and curiosity, asking insightful questions and demonstrating good knowledge from previous learning. Their respectful attitudes, understanding and eagerness to learn about their own or other faiths and beliefs was a joy to see.

Last term, we ran a competition to design a Paschal Candle for St. Augustine's Church with the theme 'Radiant Light'. Our Faith Ambassadors helped short-list the finalists from which St. Augustine's Church wardens picked a winning design. They chose Evelyn's (Y4) design which has been made into a Paschal Candle and will be used in services at St. Augustine's Church over the coming weeks. The parishioners of the church chose Saroop's (Y4) design to create a Paschal Candle for the school. We presented the school candle to the children in collective worship this morning and it is now displayed in the school foyer. Congratulations to Evelyn and Saroop and our thanks to Reverend Helen and the St. Augustine's parishioners for their support with this project and to all the children who submitted a design. All the children's designs are currently on display in St. Augustine's Church.

Spring Term Assessment Papers

In the last week of the spring term, children in Y1 – 6 completed assessment papers for reading; grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS), and maths (please note that some classes do not sit all of the same types of papers; some year groups may use teacher assessment). The children will be bringing these papers home over the next week. There will be a letter or word descriptor written on the front of some of the papers to represent the level / standard your child has achieved for this term.

- **WB = working below the standard for their year group for the autumn term**
- **WTS = working towards the standard for their year group for the autumn term**
- **EXS = working at the expected standard for their year group for the autumn term**
- **GDS = working at greater depth standard for their year group for the autumn term**

As the GPS test papers consist of two assessment papers: one grammar assessment paper and a separate spelling assessment paper, these scores will be combined and written on the front of the grammar assessment paper.

Similarly, there may be more than one maths assessment paper (in some years, there are three papers). Those scores will combine to produce an overall level for maths written on the arithmetic paper only.

If your child's class teacher felt that your child could not access the level of the assessment paper, they will have assessed them using teacher assessment of their class work. If you would like to discuss this, please contact your child's class teacher.

Working together to safeguard children 2026

The DfE have published a revised and updated version of the statutory guidance: [‘Working together to safeguard children’ \(March 2026\)](#). There are key changes relating to the way families are supported by Children’s Services. The guidance describes the different levels of support and intervention:

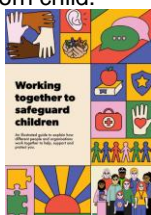
Universal services and community-based early help:

Universal services and community-based early help is support for children of all ages that improves a family's resilience and outcomes or reduces the chance of a problem getting worse. It is not an individual service, but a system of support delivered by local authorities and their partners working together and taking collective responsibility to provide the right provision in their area. This level of early help is provided through "universal services" - such as education, health - and other community-based services. It is distinct from targeted early help delivered through Family Help teams, which are more formal arrangements coordinated by local authorities, where a plan is in place and a lead practitioner appointed.

Support available at the universal offer is signposted on the school website and highlighted in weekly newsletters including referrals and events organised by MHST and Family Hubs courses available in the local area which are advertised [later in the newsletter](#).

Family Help - targeted early help, safeguarding, and promoting the welfare of children:

Targeted early help services delivered through Family Help, are coordinated by a local authority and/or their partners to address specific concerns within a family. Examples of these include parenting support, mental health support, domestic abuse services, youth services, youth offending teams and housing and employment services. Targeted early help should be provided for children and families who have multiple and/or complex needs, or whose circumstances might make them more vulnerable. This could include where a child is living with wider family members under a kinship arrangement. Targeted early help might also be appropriate to support a pregnant person to provide safe and effective care for their unborn child.

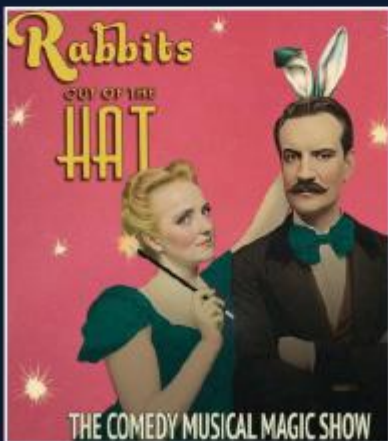
