New security system - front gate

The front side gate is now locked and operated electronically. If you wish to gain access to the school site, please press the button with the green bell icon, and a member of staff will buzz you in.

For children who walk to school on their own in the mornings, if for some reason they are late and the main gates are locked, we have explained to them how to press the button to be allowed in. Please reiterate this to them at home.

Scooters and bikes can be brought on to school premises to be stored down the path, when the main school gates are opened at 8:30am.

Children attending Koosa Breakfast Club who bring a scooter or bike to school with them, we ask that they bring it into the hall and we will make arrangements for the scooters / bikes to be put on the rack outside.

Online phonics reading homework books – YR, 1 & 2

Unfortunately, we still haven't received notice from our provider that our log-in details have been updated. In the meantime, your child will be bringing home their 'sharing' reading book from the library. We apologise for any inconvenience and share your frustration about this. We hope for it to be resolved very soon. As soon as we receive the information, we will pass it on to you.

After-school clubs – Year 5 & 6 walkers

After-school clubs started this week. This is a reminder to any parents or carers of children in Year 5 & 6, who wish to allow their child to walk home after a club, that we must have permission in writing for this, in addition to the permission for them to walk home at the end of the school day. This is particularly important as we head into the darker evenings, with children leaving school at a later time.

School Trips Payments / Permissions

Year 6 Junior Citizen - Heatham House in Twickenham

Thursday 3rd October, 9.30-11.45am

Year 6 will taking part in the Richmond Borough initiative for all primary school children which teaches them how to stay safe in various situations such as travelling on public transport and dealing with an emergency.

The trip is free and we will be walking to Heatham House, leaving school at 8:45am (as we cannot travel by public transport before 9:30am) and returning by train from Twickenham in time for lunch at 12:10pm. Children should wear their PE kits and wear/bring a waterproof coat.

Year 6 Canoeing and Kayaking, The Lensbury Club

Tuesday 8th October 10.15am - 2.15pm

Year 6 are going to take part in raft building and kayaking on the River Thames at the Lensbury Club in Teddington. This trip is free as it is covered by our PE premium and we will be travelling by bus. Please log in to your child's SCOPAY account to complete the permission form.

The children will need to wear their own clothes (preferably sportswear that you don't mind them getting wet) with an old pair of trainers/wet shoes (no crocs or sliders as these can fall off). They will also need to bring their school PE kit/underwear/socks to change into and another pair of shoes.

They will need a waterproof coat and a warm jumper/fleece in case it is wet/cold. Please can they bring a snack and packed lunch too.

In terms of safety, we have completed thorough risk assessments which have been submitted to the local authority. There will be two instructors who are lifeguard trained running the sessions and a third instructor in a speedboat on the water.

Routine vaccinations

Help children get a healthy start to the new school year by ensuring they are up to date with all their routine vaccinations

When your child starts or returns to school, they will have increased contact with other children. If they are not up to date with their routine immunisations, they may be at risk of including preventable diseases, measles, whooping cough, meningitis, diphtheria and Please check that your child is fully up to date with their routine immunisations. You can check if your child is up to immunisations by checking or contacting your GP surgery. For a full checklist of vaccines and when they should be given visit - NHS vaccinations and when to have them.


