## Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a busy week in school, with swimming lessons starting on Monday, after-school clubs starting this week and new routines and timetables well-establised and learning well underway. It's lovely to see our new Reception class settling in to school so well.

In a new initiative this year, we have created a number of new leadership positions for pupils in Year 6. The aim is to provide a platform for the pupils to take on some extra responsibility as they reach their last year in primary school, whilst also raising the profile of pupil voice. We were overwhelmed by the high-standard of applications for the various roles on offer, and I enjoyed interviewing the children for the positions. I'm delighted to have appointed our Year 6 pupils to a variety of new positions ranging from Children's Site Leaders to Languages Leader, Library Leaders to Communication Leaders, Collective Worship Leaders to Technology Leaders, to name a few. I am confident the children will rise to the challenge of their new responsibilities within school, and will be excellent role models.

Thank you for adopting our new Allergy Policy and Food and Healthy Eating Policy. A reminder that only fruit or vegetables are acceptable in school for snacks – this includes at after-school clubs. Also, we ask that at pick-up time, children refrain from eating their snack until off the school premises. Please share this information with any adults who may be picking your child up from school.

We strive to maintain good, open lines of communication between parents / carers and school, and if you have a concern we would rather hear about it sooner rather than later so we can respond appropriately. Our <a href="Communications Policy">Communications Policy</a> sets out all the ways in which you can get in touch with the school, but in the first instance of a concern, please contact you child's class teacher. Concerns should not be raised on public platforms such as class WhatsApp groups. The role of the School Association class rep is to relay SA messages in support of fundraising events, it is not to manage or speak on behalf of parents about any concerns that may have arisen with their child in class. The role of the Parent Forum class rep is to gather views of parents and carers on items that they would like to be put forward for discussion at Parent Forum, not individual concerns or complaints. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Speaking of the Parent Forum, we are due to hold our autumn term meeting in the next few months. We have established a very productive Parent Forum. The forums have proved invaluable in providing a space for the parent community to ask questions and make suggestions, and for the school to respond, with minutes of the meeting shared on the website to keep everyone informed. We currently have a vacancy to chair this forum. The role of Chair involves sending emails to the Forum members to remind them to collect feedback; putting the feedback together; chairing discussion in the meeting; writing up the minutes and liaising with Miss Macklearn. The role could also be shared if necessary. If you would be interested in chairing the forum for 2025 – 26, or in being a parent rep, we would love for you to be involved. This is open to all parents, including our new Reception clas parents. Please contact Miss Macklearn if you would like to volunteer – thank you.

## **Governor News**

Governors met on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September for the first meeting of the year. We are delighted to hear that children and staff have had a settled and positive start to the new term. We are pleased to announce that Mrs Williams has been reappointed as Chair of the Governing Board for 2025-26 and welcome new governors, Reverend Kate and Reverend Helen and a new clerk, Lisa Lopez. Please consider promoting the role of governor to family, friends and colleagues.

#### **Governor Vacancies**

The school has vacancies for two governors at present. In accordance with our constitution, neither can be filled by a parent of a child currently attending the school, or by anyone on the electoral roll of St Augustine or SS Philip & James. But do you have a friend or colleague who might be interested in joining the governing body? Someone with experience in IT / AI would be particularly welcome at this time.

Being a school governor offers an opportunity to make a difference to the lives of young people, and an opportunity to develop new skills in leadership, working collaboratively, developing strategic thinking and to make connections with the local community.

We normally have seven full governing body meetings a year, spread across the three terms, which take place in school usually at 6pm. In addition, governors are assigned to link roles or sub-committees. We very much encourage our governors to visit the school and take part in 'learning walks' which focus on a particular aspect of school life or the curriculum.

The governing body uses the platform Governor Hub which holds all documents, notifications and the calendar in one place. We have the services of a clerk to support governors with administration.

Governors are expected to take advantage of appropriate training, often available online, provided both by the local authority and the diocese. In addition, many of our governors have worked with the school for a number of years and are happy to share their experience.

## **School Trips Payments / Permissions**

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). Children should bring a bag (school bag or other) to carry their packed lunch and water bottle in. #### **Swimming Lessons**

It is our school uniform policy that children can wear a plain-coloured swimming costume for swimming lessons, preferably a plain black swim suit / trunk. For safety reasons, they must also wear a school swimming hat (or a plain yellow one) as they will not be allowed into the pool without one. On swimming days, the children will need to come into school in the morning with their swimming costumes on under their PE kit, and bring a towel and underwear in a small bag with their name on to take to the pool (a small, drawstring bag is ideal). Please make sure that your child brings a warm coat to school with them.

## Safeguarding, Wellbeing and Inclusion Parent & Carer Alert: The "Salt & Ice Challenge"

A dangerous online trend is resurfacing where children put salt on their skin and press ice on top.

- This causes serious cold burns (like frostbite)
- Injuries can need hospital treatment and even skin grafts
- Young people may not realise the damage until it's too late

First Aid: warm area with immersion in warm water for 30 - 60 minute, cover with clean cling film, and seek medical help.

X Do NOT Rub or massage the area to avoid further tissue damage, Do Not use ice, creams, or fluffy dressings.

Dear parent or carer,

Your child's flu vaccination is now due.

The Richmond Immunisation Team will visit your child's school on 21/10/2025

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. If you would like to know more about the flu vaccine, please visit the NHS website. A leaflet can also be collected from your child's school.

Please discuss the vaccine with your child, and use the link provided to access and complete the electronic consent form:

https://cypcis.kingstonandrichmond.nhs.uk/flu/2025/richmond (Link closes:16/10/2025)

Your child will be offered the live nasal flu spray or the injectable porcine-free flu vaccine. The nasal spray vaccine is a quick and simple spray up each nostril. Alternatively, you can choose for your child to have the injectable porcine-free vaccine. This is given as an injection into the upper muscle of the arm.

It is recommended that your child have the flu vaccine every year due to changes in flustrains circulating each year, even if they had the vaccine last year.

Please ensure you complete the consent form, even if you choose not to vaccinate your child this year. NHS England requires that we provide numbers of parents that do not consent to their child being vaccinated. If you do not complete your consent form, you may be contacted by phone, text, or letter, to offer your child future opportunities to receive a vaccination. If you return a 'no' consent, we will not make any further contact this year. For more information on this, please see our privacy notice.

We offer all children and young people the opportunity to receive their vaccinations in an appropriate and comfortable environment. Our teams hold clinics over the school holiday periods, some weekends, and after school sessions. Please contact your local immunisation team to book a clinic appointment, or for more information.

## The Incredible Years Toddler Programme

The programme is an evidence-based parenting programme used all over the world for parents and carers of children aged 1 to 3. It is designed to promote positive parent-child relationships, strengthen parenting skills, and prevent or reduce challenging behaviours like aggression and defiance.

The program typically consists of 12 weekly group sessions where parents learn skills through video vignettes, group discussions, and role-playing. A shorter six week version of The


