Headteacher's Hello

Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday, we were treated to a wonderful Year 5 class assembly when they shared all about their visit to the Isle of Wight in May. It was clear from the assembly what a fantastic time the children had and how many special memories were made. Thank you to Miss Murray and all the staff who helped the children prepare for their assembly.

This week, Year 1 have completed their statutory Year 1 Phonics Check. Well done to all the children in Year 1; they were able to show off how well they are doing with learning their phonics and their early reading. We are very proud of them.

Earlier in the week, Year 3 took part in the Safer Walking programme as part of our wider curriculum provision for road safety. They were very sensible during their activities and their instructors reported positively on their engagement in the programme.

We have noticed that some children have been bringing in their own fidget toys or 'squishy' toys to school. Please note, only those children who have use of a fidget toy identified on their learning support plan are to have a fidget toy in school, and this is with prior agreement with the class teacher. Squishy toys are not allowed at all. There are concerns about the filling of these toys and the safety implications if they burst.

This week, your child will have brought home a book of raffle tickets in support of the SA Summer Fete. There are some great prizes to be won and the draw will take place at the fete in the afternoon on Sunday 28th June.

Thank you for those of you who have completed our parent and carer survey. Parents and Carers - An opportunity to help the local council understand your childcare needs and how they can develop the local childcare sector to meet them

Every year councils have to report on childcare in their area to ensure they are meeting the needs of families and their children. In Kingston and Richmond the Childcare Sufficiency Assessment report is produced by Achieving for Children, who provide children's services for Kingston and Richmond councils.

To build a clear picture of childcare (for both early years and School age children) across our area, and how well it meets the needs of local families, we are asking parents and carers who either currently use childcare or need to use childcare to complete our Parents and Family Childcare Survey - this survey is anonymous. Your feedback will help us understand what is working well, identify any gaps and inform how we can better support families and develop local childcare provision.

Parents and carers: please spend time completing this annual survey and share your views and childcare needs - your contribution is extremely valuable and we hope to receive a wide range of responses representing the needs of all families.

Bishop Perrin School 90th Anniversary

Last week, we celebrated the 90th anniversary of Bishop Perrin School. The school opened in 1936 and was originally called Bishop Perrin Memorial School, named after Bishop Perrin. On Thursday morning, during Open School, we did activities such as making banners and writing to future Bishop Perrin School students. Our House Leaders wrote a speech about our experience at Bishop Perrin School and we all sang songs. We had a special assembly on Friday afternoon, talking about the history of our school. Our school has changed a lot over the years with new corridors, and different school trips. In assembly, the children used to face a different direction in the hall to the way we do now. The school used to have roughly 358 pupils, compared to 210 now. There was a letter from the first Headteacher, Mr Brockenshire. It said the staff were amazing and so were the students, and that remains the same. To finish the assembly we all had a celebratory chocolate cake and extra playtime. The school has changed a lot over the 90 years it's been standing here. Everybody is thankful for the amazing teachers and education.

Children are working on communication passports to share their voice about what supports them at school and build consistency between classes.

Drowning Prevention Week



Saturday 13th to Saturday 20th June is [Drowning Prevention Week](#), a national campaign led by the Royal Life Saving Society UK to raise awareness and equip families with life-saving knowledge before the school holidays. As the weather warms and families spend more time near water, it's a crucial time to talk about how to keep children safe.

Sadly there have been too many children fatalities in cold open water across the nation during the hot weather seen in May this year. Between 2019 and 2022, [84 children in England tragically drowned](#), highlighting the importance of water safety. For children under five, bathtubs are the most common location, often involving a bath seat. Teens aged 15-17 are most at risk in inland waters like rivers and lakes, especially when swimming unsupervised. [Continue reading here.](#)

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very much looking forward to our Infant and Junior Sports Day on Wednesday 1st July and hope that lots of you are able to come along to cheer the children on. There are a few things we need to share with you so that the day can run as smoothly as possible.

General

All children except Reception Class should come to school in their PE kits and can stay in them for the whole day. Reception Class will get changed into their PE kits at school. All children will need to make sure they bring a water bottle, hat and sun cream already applied, in case of warm weather. Please note that there will be some gazebos available to provide shade for the children, if necessary, but there will not be shade for spectators. The children will have chosen the races that they would like to compete in so should be able to tell you about this nearer the time.

Junior

The Junior sports day will begin at **9am** at Turing House. Parents will not be able to use the main entrance to Turing House but can use the entrance to the field via Heathfield Rec at 8.55am. Please do not go to the main Reception at Turing House. There will not be any toilets available for parents. Turing House have very kindly said that children will be able to use their toilets if necessary. We are aiming to finish by **10.15am to allow parents time to get back to Bishop Perrin for the Infants Sports Day**. If we have time, there will be parent and toddler races at the end, so be sure to bring your running gear!

Infants

The Infant sports day will begin at **10.30am** in the Bishop Perrin School playground. We would like parents to wait outside of the school gate until they are brought in through the side alley entrance at **10.25am**. There will be seats for spectators to sit on down the side of the playground (please bear in mind there is no shade on this part of the playground and it faces the sun - it can get quite hot here if it's a sunny day). We are aiming to finish by **11.15am**.

Please do feel free to take pictures and videos of your child competing in their races, but these are not to be shared on any form of social media, including class WhatsApp groups. Thank you for your support and understanding with this.

In the case of extremely hot weather, or rain, we may have to postpone the event. We will make this decision and inform parents / carers by 8:30am on the morning of Sports Day. If we do have to postpone, we have a reserve date of Thursday 9th July, for which the same arrangements will apply.
