## Water Bottles

We are witnessing an increasing number of issues regarding the safe use of water bottles in school. Most concerning is the use of metal water bottles, which when full of water are very heavy and can cause an injury if dropped, or thrown or if they hit someone. We are also concerned that we are seeing a number of very expensive water bottles coming into school, and causing much upset if they get broken. If your child has a simple plastic water bottle, we ask that they bring this into school instead of a metal one / expensive model for the rest of this term. # Check you and your family are fully vaccinated before travelling this summer

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) is reporting a recent rise in measles cases in London. Globally, cases have also increased, including in Europe. This means that travelling for holidays or to visit family this summer, may increase your risk of catching measles and becoming ill during or after travel if you are not fully vaccinated.

Anyone travelling for summer holidays or to visit family, especially parents of young children, are advised to check that all members of their family have received 2 doses of the Mumps, Measles and Rubella (MMR) vaccine. Other travel-related vaccines may be needed depending on your destination.
