SATs results – delay to results being published

It has just been announced that the original date for publication of this year's KS2 SATs results has been delayed due to technical issues with the company who manage the marking and publication of results. We were originally expecting to receive results next Tuesday, this has now been delayed until Thursday 16th July. As a result, we will delay sending our Y6 end-of-year reports out until we have received the results so that parents receive a complete report. All other reports will be sent to Years R – 5 on Monday 13th July, Year 6 reports will be sent on Thursday 16th July. Apologies for any inconvenience.

Tickets: Tickets are being sent home today to parents and carers of children in Year 5 & 6. There are two tickets per child, per performance. Entrance to the performance is strictly by ticket only to help us manage numbers in the hall, so please bring your ticket with you when you come to watch the production. If you do not need all of your tickets, it is acceptable to give them to another parent who may need extra or return them to school to be redistributed.

Some information that will help you to enjoy the performance:

- Audience participation is encouraged
- Children under 12 are not permitted to the evening performance – all the Bishop Perrin School pupils will have already watched the performance in school, so there is no need for them to attend the evening performance – thank you for your cooperation with this
- Children under the age of four are permitted to attend the afternoon performance only, but please leave prams and pushchairs in the foyer
- Please remain seated throughout the performance – **please do not stand in the aisles** - and be mindful of people seated behind you
- Toilets are available for visitors at the front entrance of the school – please do not use the children's toilets.
- Photographs and videos are permitted but please do not post any on social media without the express permission of the parents of all children who appear in the picture.
- If the fire alarm sounds, please follow the fire alarm procedure and exit the building by the fire exit leading to Hospital Bridge Road. Bishop Perrin School staff will follow procedures to ensure the children exit safely.
- If you or your guests have any accessibility needs that the school needs to be aware of, please make the school office aware in advance of the day of the performance – thank you
- Please do not bring food or drink into the hall for the performance – thank you

Evening performance on Wednesday 15th July

Arrival - all children in Year 5 and 6 will need to arrive back at school for 5pm. They will get changed into their costumes at school.

Pick up after the performance – the show is due to finish at approximately 7pm. While the children go back to their classrooms to pick up their belongings, we ask parents and carers to wait in the playground and children will be dismissed to them as we do at the end of the school day. Children who usually walk home from school by themselves will not be allowed to walk home alone from the performance, please arrange for an adult to pick them up. If someone who is not on your permission list is due to pick up your child after the performance, please let the school know. Thank you.

CONSUMER SAFETY ALERT

Water Beads

Risk of serious harm or death



Water beads are small plastic balls that expand on contact with liquid and can become up to 400 times bigger. They are sold for various purposes, including toys. If swallowed, they can cause a blockage in the gastrointestinal tract that requires surgical removal but will not show up on X-ray, making it difficult to detect. If accidentally inhaled, they can lead to coughing and choking.

Consumers are asked to be alert to the potential dangers of water beads to children:

- Always store them out of sight and reach of children
- Keep them away from young children under 5 years old
- Only let older children use them if closely supervised by an adult

Common names for water beads include aqua gel, biodegradable balls, floating pearls, gel beads, jelly balls, jelly water gems, sensory beads, silicone orbs, water absorbing beads, water balls, and water crystals.
