### **School Trips Payments / Permissions**

Unless otherwise stated, children should wear school uniform for school visits (this includes school shoes). #### **ADHD Embrace - Free ADHD Assessments**

ADHD Embrace, in partnership with The Assessment Team, is offering a limited number of free ADHD assessments for children in Years 5 and 6 (from Sept 2025) attending Richmond and Kingston state primary schools who are eligible for Free School Meals.

Assessments will be allocated by ballot throughout the year, and successful families will be contacted directly by The Assessment Team.

Eligibility:

- In Year 5 or Year 6 (Sept 2025)
- · Eligible for Free School Meals (verified by school)
- On the NHS ADHD assessment waiting list
- Supported by a named teacher/SENCo
- Ballot closes next week don't miss out!


