Parent Information Workshops

In the past, during November, we have organised an evening of information workshops for parents, designed to help you to support your child with their learning. Whilst we are aware that you have appreciated the opportunity, many have found it difficult to attend for various reasons. This year, instead of an evening of workshops, we plan to offer a range of information workshops for parents over the course of a half-term. They will be held in the school hall at 8.45am, just after drop off. These workshops will last for 15 - 20 minutes and will offer advice and guidance for supporting your child with their learning at home. We will ask you to book in advance for these workshops so we know how many people to expect, and bookings will open after half term. However, to give you advance notice of dates, coming up next half term we have:

Tuesday 14th November, 8.45am – Supporting Your Child with Reading (Miss Macklearn)

Tuesday 28th November, 8.45am – Supporting Your Child with Maths (Miss McAvoy)

Tuesday 12th December, 8,45am - Supporting Your Child with Writing (Miss Sweeney)

January / February / March: Supporting Your Child with Phonics and Early Reading - we will be offering parents of children in Year R and Year 1 the opportunity to visit their child's class to observe a phonics session being taught, to find out how the children learn their sounds and the skills to begin to learn to read. Dates and booking for these sessions will open in December.

Managing Challenging Behaviour in Young People with SEND workshops run by RUILS

If you have a child with SEND, you may find these sessions run by local charity 'RUILS' useful. They are free to attend, are run online, and are split by age:

Both will be run by autism and diversity trainer Helen Eaton, MSc, PGSE, BA. Helen has over ten years' experience as Director of a Training Company, and twenty years' experience as an Associate Trainer. Over recent years she has delivered well over five hundred training sessions on Neurodiversity and Autism to workplaces, charities, schools, families and Neurodivergent individuals. If you have a child in the upper primary years, you may find it helpful to attend both workshops. The main difference in the sessions will be the practical strategies for managing challenging behaviour, as these will differ greatly depending on the age of the young person.

Access to online games

It has come to our attention that a number of children across the school are playing 'Fortnite'. This game is rated 12+ by PEGI which indicates that it is not suitable for primary-aged children to play. If you are aware that your child has played, or been around other children who play this game (and others that are also rated beyond their chronological age), please make sure you are informed and aware of the content of the game. 
