#### Dear Parents,

**School Life** It certainly has been a busy half-term, with the start of term back in September a distant memory. We have been so impressed at how the children have settled back in after the disruption of lockdown, and in this time, they have shown how important it is that they are back at school with their friends and teachers. I know I have said this before, but thank you for all you have done to help with the arrangements, logistics and organisation of school as it is now, compared to what we are used to. You have all played a huge role in supporting not only your own child/ren, but all the other children who part of the school community.

Yesterday we conducted our first whole school fire drill, with Reception Class taking part for their first experience. All the children exited the building quietly and sensibly and we were all impressed at how maturely they conducted themselves. As a thank you to the children for how well they have settled back into school, each class was given 15 minutes on the whole of the playground (no barriers were up!) to stretch their legs and use the space. They all seemed to enjoy remembering what it is like to be able to run across the whole playground!

**School Uniform, Presentation and Clothing** We have picked up that some children are persistently not wearing correct school uniform, including wearing trainers into school rather than school shoes. Please help us by ensuring that your child comes to school with the correct items of clothing as we will be following up with letters home after half-term for those children who are infringing. This also includes general presentation of children with having their shirts tucked in when in class and having hair tied back, as is in the School Uniform Policy.

Thank you for helping support the children with getting additional dark clothing to supplement school uniform clothing whilst we have windows and doors open to maintain good ventilation. We can only anticipate that the temperature will get colder as we move into the Winter, so please make sure your child has adequate clothing to help keep them warm in the classrooms if they feel the cold.

**Punctuality** After half-term we will be following up more formally with parents if their child is arriving at school persistently late. Due to the staggered start times, especially for children in Years 3-6, if they arrive late they are having to wait until the alleyway is free of the next class that is due in. This means that some children are arriving into their classroom 10 minutes later than the rest of their class, which is having an impact on their learning, as teachers are starting lessons now earlier than normal. Please help and support your child from being disrupted at the start of the school day by ensuring they are in school on time, as it can be distressing for them arriving into class when the rest of the children are settled and getting on with their work. Thank you.

**Notifying The School About Covid Results Over Half Term** We will be checking the info@bishopperrin.richmond.sch.uk email account daily over the half-term break in case any families experience a positive Covid result. Please forward us the confirmation email you will receive notifying you of the positive result so we can then establish timelines and notify other families from your child's class if it has an impact on them. From Monday 26<sup>th</sup> October onwards, any child who tests positive will have to self-isolate without it impacting on the rest of their classmates. However, if we receive notification of a positive test over this forthcoming weekend, it might mean that a whole class will have to isolate. We will communicate any pertinent information to as soon as we are able to if there is any impact for you and your child.

#### Parent Governor Election

We received two nominations by the deadline of 12 noon today for the vacant Parent Governor role, which we are delighted about. I would like to thank Mrs McArdle and Mrs Alladin for offering to take on this role. As we have two viable candidates, we will need to now hold a formal election, which will happen after half-term. We need to use paper ballot papers, which will be sent home via the children. There will be a covering letter giving details of how to send your ballot paper in and the deadline date for submission of ballot papers. Good luck to both our candidates.

**Finally** If you are able to get away for half-term, I hope you have a restful and relaxing break. If not, I know the children will enjoy having a well-deserved break whatever they do. Thank you again for your on-going support.

#### CHILDREN'S WORKBOOKS

Today you will see that your child has brought home a series of workbooks. These may include some, but not necessarily all of the following:

- reading comprehension book
- phonics workbook
- maths workbook
- handwriting workbook
- spelling and grammar workbook

We have invested in these booklets as part of our remote learning provision. As explained in the information you received earlier in the week, in the event of a class or school lockdown, children will be provided with online learning activities via their Google Classroom, but will also be set activities to do off-line which will be activities in these work books.

We are sending these books home over half term purely as a pre-cautionary measure. With the current Covid-19 situation being very unpredictable at the moment, in the unlikely event of a 'circuit breaker' lockdown being announced during half term, we wanted to make sure the children have the

resources they need to be able to learn from home. Please be aware, we do not have any information other than what we all see on the news to suggest a further lockdown is imminent, but we feel with the fast-moving nature of developments and short notice of changes regarding such matters, we'd rather be prepared for any eventuality.

At this stage, the children are **<u>NOT</u>** to complete any of the activities in these work books until directed to by their teacher, and we would like them to be returned to school on the first day back, as we will start to use them as a class and a homework resource next half term. We have invested a significant amount of money purchasing these books, so any books that fail to be returned after half term will have to be charged for. Thanks for your understanding and support with this.

#### STATIONERY PACKS

Thank you for your support with providing your child with their stationery supplies this half term. This has helped us immensely to implement an aspect of our risk assessment that limits the sharing of resources. Half term may be a good time to replenish some of the items the children need, particularly whiteboard pens and glue sticks.

#### As a reminder, our list of stationery items are:

- 1 x small pencil case (KS2 children only)
- 3 x writing pencils
- 1 x pencil eraser
- 1 x small pencil sharpener (no battery-operated or winding mechanisms please)
- 1 x ruler (30cm)
- 2 x whiteboard pens
- 1 x glue stick
- x giue siick
- 1 x fountain pen + ink cartridges **Optional (but very helpful):**
- 6 12 x coloured pencils
- 6 12 coloured felt tips
- 1 x pair of scissors

Stationery packs in KS1 and pencil cases in KS2 will stay in school and will not be taken home every evening, so please don't send in treasured stationery items. We will provide stationery items for children who are unable to bring their own.

Up until now, children in KS2 have been keeping all their stationary items in a plastic wallet in class. However, after half term, they will be allowed to store their stationary in a pencil case once more. Due to the way our tables have to be set out in the classroom at the moment, space is limited, so children will only be able to have one pencil case on their desk. This should be used for essential items for the day. They may keep a second pencil case with felt tips, etc. in their locker for when they're needed. Please no more than two pencil cases, both of a reasonable size, not too big! Pencil cases will need to stay in lockers and will not be taken to and from home.

These changes do not affect children in YR, 1 or 2.
