The children will be learning about the story of Creation, how our world is special and how we take care of our world.

THEME

Theme name: A Knight's Tale Subject Driver: History

In this theme, in **History** children will be learning about William the Conqueror and the Battle of Hastings, and the history of castles in the UK, with a focus on Windsor Castle. In **DT** they will learn about the features of castle design and be making model castles using common materials. They will explore ways that they can make their structures stronger, stiffer and more stable. Children will also evaluate their products against a design criteria. In **Science**, they will continue to learn about different materials, relating to what they learn about castles. The children will be encouraged to ask simple questions about materials and realise that they can be answered in different ways. The children will also continue learning about the seasons as winter changes to spring. In **Music**, the children will create a class march by using percussion and instruments and clapping. They will learn in PSHE how to keep themselves safe in a variety of contexts.
