#### **THEME**

Theme name: Fire! Fire! Subject Driver: History

In this theme children will learn about the Great Fire of London. In **history** they will be looking at famous historical figures like Guy Fawkes, Samuel Pepys and King Charles II. They will investigate the causes of the Great Fire of London and learn about why the fire spread so quickly. They will learn about what life was like in 1666. In science children will learn about life processes. They will look at things that are living, once living and nonliving. In **art** children will create their own images of fire and analyse the differences between art mediums and techniques. They will learn about primary colours and changing the tone of colours. In **music** the class will be learning about different composers. They will listen to music and reflect on what they have heard. In PSHE the children will be learning about bullying and appropriate and inappropriate touch.
