Key Text: Why the Whales Came – Michael Morpurgo (ISBN13 - 978-1405229258)

Writing: Children will write recounts from the point of view of different characters based upon Why the Whales Came. They will also write a recount of their trip to the Isle of Wight.

Reading: Children will read and explore stories set in different cultures and time periods.

Spoken Word: Children will explore and use different question types and the different ways words can be used, including in formal and informal contexts.

Text and Word: Linking ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time, place and number.

Punctuation: Using commas in complex sentences and how to use commas to clarify meaning or ambiguity. **Sentence structure:** Using modal verbs (might, should, will, must) and adverbs (perhaps, surely, etc.) to indicate degrees of possibility.

<u>Theme</u>

Theme name: Creeping Coasts Subject Driver: Geography

In this theme, in **Geography** we will be studying coastal erosion and how through erosion the shapes of our coastline are formed. We will use digital maps to observe the changing shape of our coastline over the past century. We will explore volcanoes and earthquakes, where in the world they occur and why they occur. In **Science**, we will be studying forces and motion. We will recognise gravity as a dominant force on Earth. In addition, we will learn about and make a range of gears, pulleys and levers.

In **Art**, we will be investigating sand art, children will plan a sandcastle that they will make on their trip to the Isle of Wight. In **PSHE**, they will be learning about school rules about health and safety online as well as thinking about strategies to keep physically and emotionally safe.
