Clubs

Attached to this newsletter are the details for the autumn term clubs. We are pleased to announce an exciting array of clubs for our students to choose from, ranging from football to ukulele, from colouring to book club! Whether you enjoy quiet relaxing past times or prefer sporty action, there truly is something for everyone.

The number of clubs you can sign up for on Scopay will be limited initially to one per pupil. Parent/s have in the past signed up for more than one club using different email addresses. This is unfair. If this happens please note we will remove all bookings for that particular child.

The initial booking stage will open on Monday 11th September at 9am and close on Tuesday 12th September at 9.00am. However, if there are spaces, we will re-open the booking stage at 12 noon on Tuesday 12th September, allowing parents to go online to sign up for those clubs that are not full. You will be notified of this via email. Club bookings will then close for the final time on Thursday 14th September at 12.00 noon. Clubs will officially begin on the week beginning 18th September. If you sign up for a club, please ensure that payment is made promptly, ahead of the first session starting. Parents who do not pay in a timely manner will lose their place in the club and may still be charged for the placement.

Below is a reminder of how to sign up and pay for clubs:

Booking for Clubs

Log in to your child's Scopay account and click 'secure place' on your chosen club. Bookings for JA Sports, Joy for Languages and Code Camp are separate. To book these clubs please visit their websites as detailed on the clubs list.

For our French club, please see the attached flier and contact Miss Logassi directly to sign up.

Paying for Clubs

School run clubs:

Once the entire booking process has finished you will receive an email prompting you to pay for the clubs. At this time please log in to your SCOPAY account and pay for the club(s) you have signed your child up to.

External Provider led clubs:

You will receive an email containing payment details for your selected club. For JA sports and Code Camp please use the payment link provided in the extra-curricular Clubs List. For French club, please see the attached flier and contact Miss Logassi to sign up and pay for these brilliant lessons.

Important: Payment for clubs must be made prior to the start date of each club. If payment has not been received, the pupil will not be allowed to join in the activities. Please be don't put us in the awkward position of not allowing your child to attend a club. Failure to pay may result in them being removed from the club entirely.

It is important to note that if an outdoors club is unable to use the playground due to inclement weather, the club provider will run a classroom-based activity instead. Please note, refunds for clubs altered by the weather will not be available. Refunds cannot be given for clubs if students change their mind or decide not to attend.

In addition, some clubs have set a requirement for a minimum number of participants (see the attached clubs list sheet). If there is not enough interest or bookings in these sessions, the club provider reserves the right to cancel the club and not run it. People who have signed up for a club that does not run due to inadequate numbers will not be charged. Please note that clubs can be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances and illness. If a club is cancelled, we will endeavour to contact you as soon as possible.

We are able to offer a free place at any club (except French) for all children in receipt of the pupil premium grant. Please apply for your child's club place in the usual way. This provision will be reviewed termly.

We do not wish any child to miss out on attending a club; if you are not eligible for pupil premium grant and are presently experiencing temporary hardship please sign up for the club of your choice and prior to the payment deadline come and see Mrs. Forster, Miss Macklearn or Mr King. If there are any barriers preventing your child from accessing the extracurricular clubs at Bishop Perrin School, please don't hesitate to be in touch with us and we will do our best to accommodate or help out however we can.
