TEXTILE BANK @ BP SCHOOL

The UK is the fourth largest producer of textile waste in Europe, according to a new study.

Clothes can take up to 40 years to decompose and shoes can take up to 1000 years to break down. However 95% of textiles can be recycled.



This week we have had a textile bank, provided by Astra Recycling, delivered to school. Our main aim is to promote recycling and prevent used clothing ending up in landfill. In addition we will also be able to raise money for school as we will receive a small payment for each kilogramme of textiles donated. Most donations will be shipped to Eastern Europe or Africa to be worn again. Any textiles that cannot be reused are converted into industrial cleaning wipes or insulation materials.

We accept the following wearable items:

- All men's, ladies and children's clothing including School Uniform
- Paired Shoes
- Handbags, bags, ties and belts
- Bed linen, towels, soft toys

We **cannot** accept:

- · Duvets, pillows or cushions
- Carpets or rugs
- · Used underwear or socks
- Curtains
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

The textile bin is located down the side path of the school so please use the bin as often as you can and help reduce textile waste and raise funds for our school. Thank you.

PHONICS & READING PRACTICE BOOKS

In a change to our provision of the teaching of phonics in Year R and Year 1, we will now be following the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds scheme.

This is a government validated phonics teaching programme. Information about how we use this scheme to teach phonics can be found here: https://www.littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk/resources/for-parents/ We have chosen this scheme because its very similar to our previous approach to teaching phonics.

For parents of children in Year R and 1, your child's class teacher will explain more about the process of teaching phonics and how we will be using the Little Wandle scheme. Another change that parents of children in Year R. 1 and 2 will notice, is that we will no longer be sending reading practice (book-band) books home. Instead they will be assigned to your child online, on a weekly basis. This allows us to carefully match your child's reading book to their phonics knowledge and ability, link it directly to the practice book they are currently reading with their teacher in class, and it enhances the accessibility of resources we have available to us. Instructions and log-ins for your child to access their online reading practise books will be sent home in the next couple of weeks and more information about how we will be using online reading practice books will be shared at the parent information meeting next week.

In the meantime, more information can be found by following the link above and clicking on the tab labelled 'Books coming home'.

Children in YR, 1 and 2 will continue to bring a book home from school, but this will be a book selected from the library and is designed to be shared with an adult. Your child is not required to be able to read their library book, but enjoy sharing the story by having an adult read it to them.

Children in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 will continue to bring home a copy of their reading practice (book-band) book, as necessary.

If you have any concerns about being able to access the books online, please contact your child's class teacher after the parent information meeting next week and we will be able to help you.

CHARGING AND REMISSIONS POLICY

We would like to draw to your attention some changes to our Charging and Remissions Policy (which is attached with the newsletter), effective for the start of this new school year. We will now make a charge to parents if we are asked to write and submit a reference for a child who is applying to a selective school that is over and beyond our statutory requirements. In addition, we will also make a charge for the validation of visa renewal letters. Parents who need a counter-signatory for a passport application (for either a Bishop Perrin pupil or parent) can request the school to provide this at a cost of £20. The parent/child will need to have been known to the school for a minimum of two years before we are able to counter-sign a passport application.
