It's been a quieter week this week at school, but thankfully the playground is now draining very quickly, so despite all the rain we have had this week, the children have been able to get out to play without having to negotiate small oceans! We have had some football fixtures this week, with the girls in particular being rather busy. On Monday we played our league fixtures for both boys and girls against Chase Bridge. ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

This week in school we have been celebrating Anti-Bullying Week. Bullying behaviour is repeated, negative behaviour that is intended to make others feel upset, uncomfortable or unsafe. In school, we have Anti-Bullying Ambassadors from Years 4-6 who have been trained by the Diana Award. They are always available on the playground for children to turn to if they feel like they are experiencing bullying behaviour.

Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors led an assembly to the whole school on Tuesday to introduce the theme of the week, during this time they introduced a competition to design an anti-bullying t-shirt. The Anti-Bullying Ambassadors were overwhelmed with the number and quality of the entries and picking a winner was extremely difficult!! Congratulations to Charlotte H in Year 6 who designed the winning entry and was awarded her prize in Worship this morning. Thank you to everyone who entered! HAND, FOOT & MOUTH

We are seeing a number of cases of what we think is Hand, Foot and Mouth disease, mainly in Reception Class.

Having been in touch with the Health Protection Unit (HPU), they have asked us to ascertain how many cases of Hand, Foot and Mouth that have been confirmed by a medical professional. If your child has been diagnosed recently as having this can you please email in and let us know as soon as possible. Please don't worry, children are allowed in school with this but we need to keep a track of the numbers and may need to report numbers to the HPU. If numbers rise drastically we may need to take further action.

The HPU has advised; if a child has a rash that has not been diagnosed by a medical professional that you take them to the doctors to provide reassurance that there are not, in fact, a number of different illnesses in circulation in the school at the same time. Please note if we have a child in school that has a rash, and we have not heard from you what the rash is, we will be contacting you to ask you to collect your child and get the rash diagnosed by a medical professional.

CALLING ALL RUNNERS! THE BEE-LIEVE 10KM FUNDRAISER IN JUNE 2023

Just in case you didn't see the email we sent out earlier this week, please see below. Thank you very much to the parents who have sent emails in saying they wanted to take part-it is much appreciated. If there are any other parents who would like to be involved, it's not too late, so drop us an email and let us know!

You will recall that we have been involved recently with a small school-based charity called the Bee-lieve Foundation who raise money to help schools support children's mental health and wellbeing. We have held some mufti days for them to thank them for the support and resources they have given to Bishop Perrin over the last couple of years.

We have been invited by the Bee-lieve Foundation to put together a team of 10 runners to take part in a 10km run in June 2023, along with other schools who are involved with supporting Bee-lieve. As part of this big fundraising effort, they are recruiting 10 people to do a skydive, with a team of 10 runners per skydiver all raising money together. Thankfully we do not need to recruit a skydiver! However, we would love to get at least another six runners to be part of the BP Crawlers Team, as we have four members of staff who are keen and eager to go. We can of course have over ten runners as part of the BP Crawlers Team, so the more the merrier. Our aim will be for each BP Crawler to raise a minimum of £100 each, to give a combined BP Crawlers Team contribution of at least £1000. If we can raise more, even better!

Turing House School staff are also taking part, so it would be lovely to get a Whitton-schools representation to take part in the run, which is scheduled for Sunday 25th June on Horsell Common in Woking. Thankfully hey have managed to recruit two skydivers from their staff, so in effect we will be putting together a running team to support one of their skydivers.

If you would be interested in being part of the BP Crawlers Team, please send in an email to let us know. You don't have to be Mo Farah or Paula Radcliffe to take part, just willing to give it a go and try and raise as much money as possible for the Bee-lieve Foundation. It's early days with the planning, but Turing House have offered to use their minibus to help drive our runners to and from Woking on the day of the run and as the Bee-lieve Foundation will be entering so many runners into the race, they are hoping to get a discounted entry fee for each runner. The cost per runner for the 10km run this year was £19, but we hope it will be lower than that for 2023. Once we know how many runners we can gather from the BP community, we can start making some plans as to how we can support each other.
