During their visit, Miss Macklearn reported how respectful and considerate the children were whilst conducting their visit and learning more about the servicemen, from both the First and Second World Wars whose graves they visited. We are very grateful to Mr Laing (Snr), Charlie and Holly's Grandad, who has been of great help in supporting this visit. Our hope is that the children will be able to make the visit to London to see The Cenotaph and visit the Abbey at some stage later in the school year.

Safeguarding

You may be aware that schools across the country have been asked to take a more robust approach to dealing with issues of sexual harassment and violence and to take a zero-tolerance approach to this behaviour. Over the course of this academic year, one of our main school objectives is to review, revise and update our Behaviour Policy to reflect the changes being asked of us. This will involve consultation with the children, staff, Governors and parents. Our work with the children will be delivered through our Personal, Social and Health Economic (PSHE) curriculum, along with our School Values.

We are fortunate at Bishop Perrin that incidents of sexual harassment and violence are incredibly rare, but that does not mean that we are taking a complacent or relaxed view of ensuring the children are aware of their behaviours and actions and how it impacts others.
