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YEAR 1 & 2 NATIVITY PERFORMANCE

Year 1 and 2 will be working hard to learn their lines and songs for our annual Nativity performance at the end of term. We are delighted to be able to invite you to see it – this will be the first time the infants have rehearsed and performed a full Nativity since 2019. It is called 'Barmy Bethlehem'.

Year 2 will be acting the main parts, supported by Year 1 who will be joining them in learning the songs and performing two songs of their own.

Performance times

- Monday 12th December at 9:45am: dress rehearsal to the rest of the school only
- Monday 12th December at 2:15pm: matinee performance to families including babies and toddlers
- Tuesday 13th December at 5:30pm: evening performance to families adults and non-Bishop Perrin school age children only

Siblings who attend Bishop Perrin will all have the chance to see the show on Monday at the dress rehearsal so they will not be permitted at the evening performance to keep space for adults and those who have not been able to attend the matinee. Please do not bring siblings to the 5:30pm performance on Tuesday. School age children who attend other schools, may attend.

Tickets

You will be given four tickets with your child's name on – two for the matinee (red) and two for the evening (green). You do not need to use them all, but will be asked to give a ticket when you arrive. This will help us to manage numbers and prepare the hall for each show. If you have a spare ticket and want to give it to someone else, that is fine.

Drop-off and collection arrangements

For the evening performance, please drop your child at school at 5pm on Tuesday 13th December and collect them from the middle doors in the Hall at approximately 6:10pm. If your child is unable to attend the evening performance, please let us know as soon as possible. We hope that all children will be able to attend.

Costumes and props

Year 1: plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms, a plain white T-shirt or jumper.

Year 2: each child will be given a role by Miss Lancaster and you will be told individually what costume your child will require. We have lots of costumes at school so most children will be provided for. You may just need to make a small prop or decoration.

Other

Please help your child to learn their lines and to be able to say them confidently. Please also encourage them to practise the songs at home so that they are familiar with the words and the actions. Word sheets will be sent home next week.

Please notify the school if you have any accessibility needs (e.g. use a wheelchair) so that we can make appropriate arrangements. For the afternoon performance, pushchairs will need to be left outside.

At the end of each performance, we will be collecting loose change (and notes!) to put towards out 'Performing Arts Fund'. Thank you in advance for your generosity. Before the matinee performance on Monday 12th December, Year 5 and 6 will sing Christmas carols on the courtyard.
