Also on Monday and Tuesday of this week, Friendship Class (Reception) gave a wonderful performance to their parents of some carols and Christmas songs they have learnt. They sang enthusiastically and were so pleased to see their parents come to watch them at the end of their first term at Bishop Perrin.

Thank you to Fr John for all his help and support in allowing the service to go ahead and to all the parents who helped walk with the children to and from Church. A special "thank you" to Mrs Place for all the work she put in to prepare the children and to for getting them to perform to such a high standard.
