HOUSE SYSTEM AND REWARDS

From this term, all children in Year 1 and Year 2 will be included in one of our four school houses – Canterbury (red), Salisbury (green), Winchester (blue) and York (yellow). They will not need to wear house coloured T-shirts for PE but by being included will share in a sense of team work and competition that the juniors currently experience when earning ‘rewards’ at school.

Across the school, from next week, ‘rewards’ can be given to children either for ‘Learning and Achievement’ – gold stars, or ‘Behaviour and Values’ – silver stars. When children are awarded a ‘reward’, either verbally by a member of staff or in their books, they will stick a gold or silver star onto their reward chart. Children who earn the most rewards will receive a bronze, silver or gold certificate at the end of term and the House with the most rewards will be awarded a mufti day to recognise their achievement.
